

ENTERPRISE. The General Feeling of the Mississagua and Chippewa Nations in Case of War.

From the Grand River Sachem, April 20.1 As my nation is not so numerous and concentrated in one body togetheras the Six Nations, our brethren, are, who can raise 800 warriors; but yet from our various bands we can still muster 1000 warriors, at least, composed of the various bands of Mississaguas and Chippews, and there are more than forty thousand Chippewas, Ottawas, Potawatamies, Crees at Red River, Lake Winnipeg and the Lake of the Woods and Lal e Superior.

I hope our Government will deal wisely with the Indian nations, so as to make a bond of peace and prosperity within the country, and suppress the pebellion at Red River, up there, without shedding blood, but if our Government desire to take up weapons of war, to strengthen one another, the Indians will be justified in doing so, to sustain the cause of their great mother and the Government to which they have always been loval. The Mississagua and Chippewa Nations are always ready to do what they can to assist our Great Queen of England in the defence of our country, and stand side by side of each other. If our Government accept his brother the red man's offer, we are ready to tender our setvic s in the Red River Country. We always ofers w are loyal to our good Queen, as we. are under Her protection, though our forefathers were not treated as well as they might have been in respect of their land and money, and we, their posterity, have to suffer for their

misdeeds. But now, however, the present generation, are more or less enlightened and educated, and by degrees the red man will come up to the white man his brother. As we so much appreciate our present condition, through the instrumentality of our brother the white man, who brought us the Word of Life, we look forward to be wiser and happier, and to be-

come useful and good citizens. I see in the Christain Guardian published concerning the Indians of the North West their address to our Government, requesting it to de them justice for their lands, &c., they are anxious to be treated with justice for their lands by the English Government. Now these nations have a right to ask for these things, as they claim the country under a better right than the Hudson Bay Company, and they are loyal to England also.

I hope our Canadian Government will comply with-their wishes in a satisfactory manner, and by all means let our Government have interpreters and peace makers from Canada, and these should be Indians who can speak their language as well as the English language. I for one will offer myself in that capacity if our Government so desire it, and I will de
