A FALSE RUMOUR.

RETURN OF THE "CHICORA. At twenty-five minutes past six, last evening, a slight speck was visible in the distance away up the Bay; and the couple of gentlemen who first observed it, speculated as to what it could mean. The speck enlarged, and was made out, with the aid of a telescope, to be a steamer; and as the vessel approached nearer, it was recognized to be the Chicora. The news spread through the little town like wild fire; and men, women and children hurried down to the wharf and watched with intense interest the approaching steamer.
