





Item 61. (To work, retrimming sack, \$68.) I made this for her the year before; she sent it on Thursday, with a note to have it on Saturday ; she had annoyed me by not keeping her app intments; it was 20 entirely ripped, and it was pressed between flannels; no price was agreed upon; it was reasonable, precisely exact, and made up by the day. Madame Golden's, Clinton place, New York : she did not know the price ; Mrs. 27 Coolidge knew that my price was \$5 a day while I was in Ayon place; at that time she said she wished to ask me some questions ; she felt she could get her dresses for less; she wanted to know how I made up my price for retrimming a certain velvet garment ; I said I charged \$5 a day ; she said it was satisfactorily perfect; we talked over the prices considerably; as to materials, my rule is, if I purchase at wholesale, to charge the retail prices; if I buy at Stewart's, and find that they are selling lower here, I never charge a cent more than they are charging here; if there is a whole piece, I mark it so much, as I did with the seersucker; if I buy here at retail, it is for a special case.
