WASHINGTON.—The Senate had another secret session on the 1st of Domingo subject, yesterday, in which there were threatening words and lively character.

The friends of the treaty have little hope of its ratification. President Grant, however, has not yet abandoned the idea of securing the ratification, and has taken the necessary steps to have the time extended.

At the instance of Bonaparte, of Buffalo, an amendment was attached to the miscellaneoua appropriation bill, which was passed yesterday morning, repeating the act which laid up the revenue cutters on the lakes, and authorizing the Secretary of the Treasury to put them in commission with instructions to sail directly without reserve.

Quebec, June 30.

The investigation of the robbery committed by Levesque from the residence of Judge Smith, Montreal, concluded this morning. The prisoner will have trial in the latter city to-day. He is a quiet looking young man.

GREAT BRITAIN.

Funeral of the Earl of Clarendon—Captain Eyre Again—All Quiet in Cork.

LONDON.—Mr. John Bright's restoration to health is thought permanent.

The funeral of the late Earl Clarendon took place to-day. In accordance with the wishes of the deceased, he is quietly buried.

Vice-Chancellor Sir W. M. James is appointed Lord Justice of the Court of Appeals.

In the case of Lyons vs. Thomas, where defendant sued for abduction of Esther Lyons, and her conversion from Judaism, the plaintiff was non-suited.

Additional correspondence between the Board of Trade and Captain Eyre, of the *Osceola*, is published. It closes with a communication from the Board refusing to re-open the case.

The House of Commons was engaged in the consideration of local matters to-day.

A tenement house at Leith containing fourteen families was destroyed by fire last night.

Lord Amberly on the occasion of laying the corner stone of a congregational school house at Newcastle to-day, made an address, in which he said he believed it was the duty of the government to supply means of education, but could not accept any substitute for voluntary schools.

The Liverpool Chamber of Commerce, to-day, adopted the late Earl Clarendon, and decided that in England lost a prominent statesman.
