WAR NOTES.

The following advertisement appears in the Cologne Gazette of the 27th July: Rewann, an Ex-Prussian. To the German who first takes Turin, in order to show him in the Zoological Garden of this city.

The Volunteers in Algeria for the Turcos are so eager, that three new regiments are to be formed, which will raise the strength of those troops to 25,000.

A German paper calls attention to the fact that the French troops carry out one eagle in each regiment, and that in September the standard of the Ministry of War issued a regulation, according to which the standard of the Foreign Legion in the service of France are so numerous in Trieste, that the French Consul there has been compelled to close his list, in order to communicate with the Government, and ask for instructions.

The Prussian correspondent of the Manchester Examiner states that the engagement at Saarbruck lasted six hours. The 7th order, *Marché à l'ennemi*, was issued. The French loss must have been greater. A number of prisoners were brought to Coblenz.

ENGLAND.

Can Neutrality Be Preserved—Defence of the French Coast. From the N. Y. Herald. LONDON, Aug. 6, 1870.

Matters are evidently coming to a crisis, and it will require all the diplomacy of the present government to keep out of the present European troubles.

The coast guard squadron, or second reserve squadron of ironclads, have left the coast of Ireland, and will soon take up their several stations for the protection of the coast.

The whole coast guard fleet consists of more than forty vessels of all classes, and represents a number of 40,000 tons, and over 800 horse power, with an armament of 160 guns and force of more than 3,000 officers, men, marines and boys.

The Admiralty, during the past week has summoned the several admiral superintendents of the royal yards to headquarters to consult with Vice-Admiral Sir Spencer Robinson, the Chief of the Staff of the Department.

The Royal Sovereign armor-plated turret-ship, five guns, 4,765 tons, 300 horses, is the only one of the class of turret-ship which Queen Victoria remains at her marine residence at Osborne, was yesterday visited by Her Majesty, who, I am told, expressed her gratification and inquiries as to the working of the turret.

The Hon. Mr. Carling has been elected President of the London, Ont., Rowing Club. Another illustrated comic paper made its appearance in Dublin last week. It is entitled, "The Knight Errant."

The only thing done on the 15th of the month was the raising of the rank made vacant by the decease of Admiral Farragut.

A boarding house in Boston advertises that "four Christian young men are wanted. They are to be employed in the Fall Mail Office, and will be provided with board and lodging." Prayers are offered weekly in the French synagogues for the success of the imperial army. The Jews are prominent among the patriotic of France.
