

BY-LAW No.313

To make some provisions against the spread of Small Pox and other Contageous or infectious diseases, and to prevent the interment of the dead within the City of Ottawa, after the Thirty-first day of December, A.D.

WHEREAS it is necessary to make some provisions against the spreading of Small Pox and other contagious or infectious diseases within the City of Ottawa, and also to prevent the interment of dead bodies within the limits of the said City after the Thirty-first day of December

That the occupant of any dwelling house within the City wherein any case o Small Pox or other contagious or infectious disease now exist or shail and may hereafter exist shall immediately upon its being known to him or her of the existence of such disease, put, place and keep np on or over the front entrance door o the said house a printed notice, placed 1871, weighing the great weight of thereon in a conspicuous manner, during the continuance of the said disease th n. and for the space of ten days ther-

> Corporation. 2 That the body of any person who shall die within this City from Small Pox shall be interred within two days at farthest from the time of his or her death. 3. That it shall not be lawful for any person or persons, bodies politic or corporate, to permit or suffer or be party to the permitting or suffering any dead body in any house, building or other place or places within this City uninterred for any longer period than five days without the written permission of the Board of Health.

sound of a drum. CAUSES OF SUDDEN DEATH.

Yery few of the sudden deaths which are said to arise from diseases of the heart. do really arise from that cause. To ascertain the real origin of sudden deaths. the experiment has been tried in Europe and reported to a scientific congress held in Strasburgh. Sixty-six cases of suiden death were made the subject of a thorough post mortem examination. In these cases only two were found that had died of diseases of the heart. Nine out of twenty-six died from apoplexy, while DIRECT IMPORTATIONS there were forty-six cases of congestion of the lungs, that is, the lungs were so full of blood that they could not work there not being room enough for sufficient air to enter to support life. The causes that produce congestion of the lungs are cold feet, tight clothing, costive bowels, sitting still until chilled after being warmed with labor or a rapid walk; going too suddenly from a close, heated room into the cold air, especially after speaking, and sudden depressing news operating on Thos.
