BY-LAW No. 313. THE ROMANCE OF MEDICINE.

To make some provisions against the spread of Small Pox and other contagious or infectious diseases...

WHEREAS it is necessary to make some provisions against the spreading of Small Pox or other contagious or infectious diseases within the City of Ottawa...

Therefore the Council of the Corporation of the City of Ottawa do hereby enact and ordain as follows:

1. That the occupant of any dwelling house within the City wherein any case of Small Pox or other contagious or infectious disease now exist or shall and may hereafter exist...

2. That the body of any person who shall die within this City from Small Pox or other contagious or infectious disease...

3. That from and after the thirty-first day of December next it shall not be lawful for any person or persons, bodies politic or corporate to permit or suffer or be party to the permitting or suffering any dead body in any house, building or other place or place within this City uninterred for any longer period than five days without the written permission of the Board of Health.

4. That it shall not be lawful for any person or persons to inter or bury any dead body within the limits of the City of Ottawa.

5. Any person or persons offending against any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable to a fine not exceeding five dollars or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding one month.

6. That from and after the thirty-first day of December next it shall not be lawful for any person or persons, bodies politic or corporate to bury or inter any dead body within the limits of the City of Ottawa.

7. Any person or persons offending against any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable to a fine not exceeding five dollars or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding one month.

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THE ROMANCE OF MEDICINE.

It really appears, says an English magazine writer, that men may have serious attacks of disease and know little or nothing about it.

Some gentlemen had been stopping together, and had afterwards taken to naps. One of them had a violent pipe and he was stricken with paralysis.

His friend declared that they could not perceive it, but he perceived that his mouth was on one side and he asked a friend to accompany him home.

A friend called next day and found him very angry with his barber for not seeing any alteration in him. But in the course of the day his condition became worse and he died in about six months.

It is not unlikely that there are many cases of insipient paralysis which are quite unnoticed by the sufferer.

The case of Mr. Humphrey, one of the leaders of the Mill and Cure, in England, was a very remarkable one. He suffered from a peculiar cancerous affection, the nature of which was not discovered until after the performance of an operation.

The case was so rare that an anonymous account of it was published in a medical work. At this time Mr. Humphrey was in all appearance established in perfect health. He happened to read the article and recognized it as his own case. He then proceeded to arrange his affairs and put his house in order, dying within a few days.
