Miss Susan B. Anthony has issued an appeal on behalf of the National Woman's Suffrage Association to the "Women of the United States," calling upon them to use their every effort to elect General Grant and to secure an overwhelming defeat for his opponent.

The members of the Geneva Tribunal were in session several hours yesterday. So careful was the secretary to preserve the strictest secrecy concerning the deliberations that with heroic self-sacrifice the entire party of English representatives have declined to enjoy the delights of Geneva Society.

The rebellion in Cuba is said to be gaining strength. Three of the would-be assassins of the King of Spain and twenty-seven alleged accomplices have been arrested.

A large sum of money was found on one of the prisoners engaged in the attempt to assassinate the King and Queen. This, together with the antecedents of the other prisoners, it is believed, conclusively establishes that the men had no political feeling which had prompted them to attempt the deed, but were merely hired instruments of a political conspiracy.

Previous to the attempt the King had received an anonymous communication, warning him that his life was in danger, and was exceedingly angry at the time of the attempt. It is generally believed that the parties arrested are the same who assassinated Gen. Prim.

We are glad to hear that Mr. Pickard, M. P. for York, N. B., will be unopposed. The nomination in Northumberland County, N. B., takes place on the 29th inst. The polling on the 5th of August. Hon. Mr. Mitchell will be returned by acclamation.
