A PROOF OF THE DISTURBANCE BETWEEN THE HOOK & LADDIE COMPANIES AT THE FIRE ON SUNDAY MORNING LAST, THE FOLLOWING LETTER HAS BEEN ADDRESSED TO THE CAPTAINS OF BOTH OTTAWA AND CHAUDEIRE COMPANIES, RESPECTIVELY, WITH REFERENCE TO THE CHALLENGE TRIAL BETWEEN THOSE TWO COMPANIES, BY MR. JOHN LANGFORD, CHIEF OF THE CITY FIRE BRIGADE:

CITY HALL, OTTAWA, July 29th, 1872.

CAPT. McCAFFERY.

DEAR Sir.—In consequence of the disturbance between the Hook & Laddie Companies and the fire engines at the fire yesterday, I am obliged to inform you that as Chief of the Fire Brigade, I cannot consent with my duty over the contest between your engine and the Chaudiere to proceed. If you insist on doing so you must first obtain the consent of the other fire companies.

Trust you will kindly let me be only actuated by the desire to promote the efficiency and save the credit of the Fire Brigade.

I have written the same to Capt. Livingstone.
