The first volume of the "History of the Franco-German War," prepared by the istorical section of the Prussian General Staff, has just appeared at Berlin. It con tains a very interesting memorandum drawn up by General Von Moltke in the winter of 1868, setting forth a complete plan of eampaign in the event of war with France, and this plan was carried out in broke out in 1870.
