DEPARTMENT OF CROWN LANDS, Toronto, 25th of July, 1872.

Under an Order in Council passed the 18th ultimo, respecting Timber on patented, sold, and undated lands on the North Shore of Lake Superior, the absolute right to the pine trees growing or growing on said lands may be acquired or purchased by being made to the Department of Crown Lands, or by the title of city owners in addition to the price, one dollar per acre paid, or to be paid for such lands.

Owners of patented lands, and purchasers of lands, the title of which is not being contested, who desire to desist from the right to the pine timber thereon are required to apply for such right, and make payment as above, within six months from date of this notice.

Applicants to purchase lands after date of this notice are required to apply for the right to the pine trees thereon at the time of application to purchase the lands, and to pay for such right at the time of application fifty cents per acre as above specified, in addition to the one dollar per acre payable for the lands.
