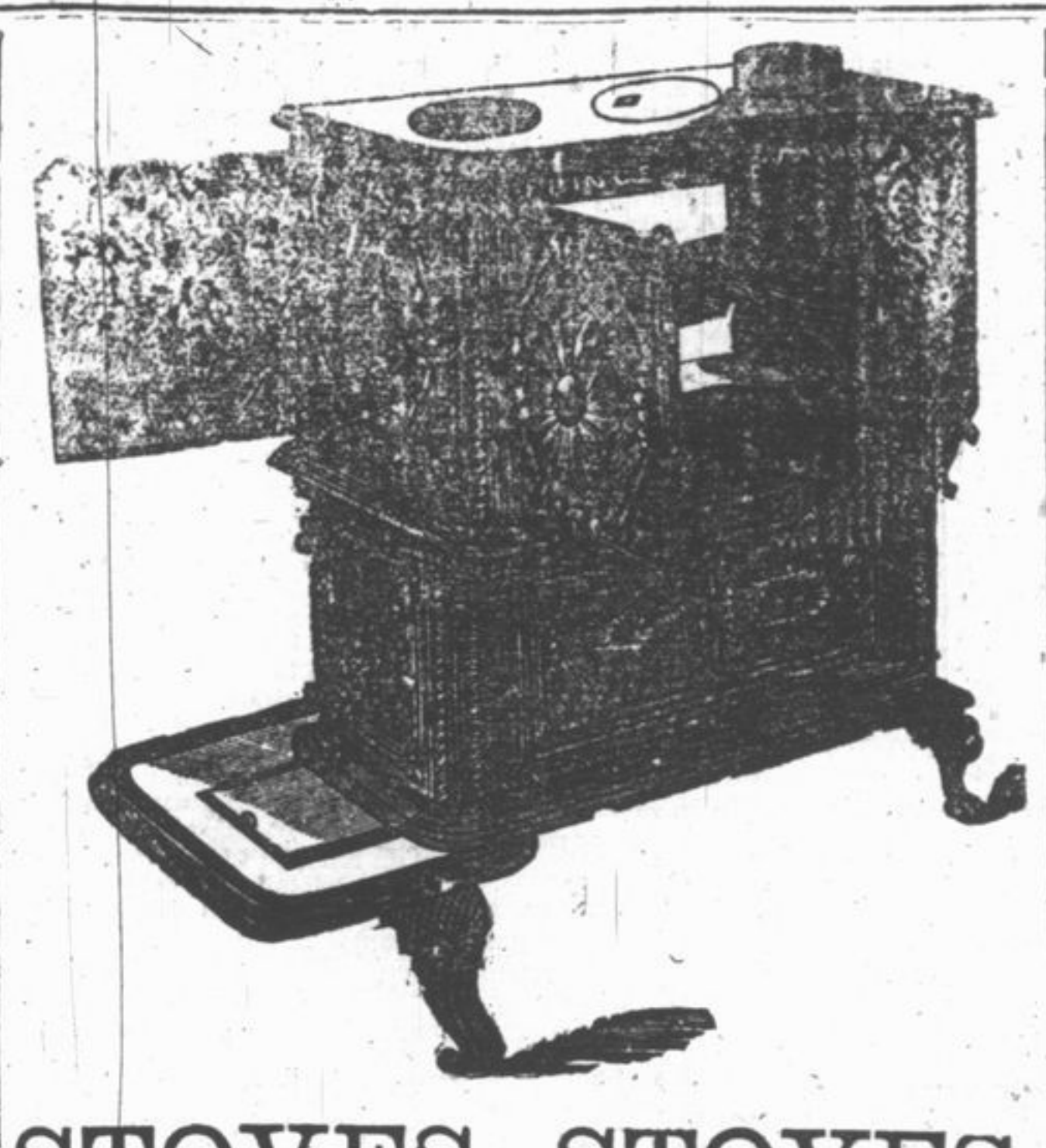

It has been the good fortune of few colonists to receive such honours as have been conferred upon Sir John A. Macdonald by the Queen. Soldiers have been better rewarded or more judiciously bestowed. It will be remembered that, in recognition of his eminent services in connection with the Confederation of the Dominion, the Queen did him the distinguished honor of appointing him one of her Joint High Commissioners and other international dignitaries; and it is now known with what ability, tact and fidelity he discharged the duties of the office. It will be remembered that, in January last he was created a Knight Grand Cross of the Royal Order of St. Michael and St. George, and that, at the same time, he was appointed to the post of High Commissioner for the Dominion of the United Kingdom in British Columbia.
