A most daring robbery took place early on Wednesday morning at Waterford near Troy, in which a gang of nine desper adoes, dressed in Ku-Klux unworm, robbed the Saratoga County Bank of over \$300,000. Secreting themselves over Van Hoevenbergh, the cashier, they bound and gagged the whole family, except the latter, whom they compelled to open the vaults of the bank. The bank itself loses about \$8,500, but the special depositors will lose over \$300,000 in bonds and stocks. A reward of \$10,000 is offered

for the arrest of the robbers.

We learn that there are now thirty-seven Post Offices in operation in British Coltmbia. The aggregate length of the mail routes, exclusive of the routes of Ulympia and San Francisco, is 2,290 miles, of which 1,447 miles are land and 843 water service. The annual travel of the mail over these routes is 125,768 miles-77,842 being traversed' by land, and 48,926 by water.
