It is rumored that Mr. DeBellefeuille, of the Northern Colonization Railway, and Mr. Baker, of the Canada Central, have been appointed joint secretaries of the Canada Railway Company.

The Department of Public Works is now busily engaged in extending the limits of the tenders received up to the 4th inst. for the Carillon dam improvements.

The papers of Montreal have published what is supposed to be a copy of the contract between the Canadian Pacific Railway Company and the Government.

The contract for completing Sections No. 3, 6, 9 and 13, on the Intercolonial Railway, formerly let to Bellinquet & Co. and Bertrand & Co., has been awarded by the Commissioners at their last meeting.

These sections, about eighty-five miles in length, comprise the Estevanque River, the Estevanque Lake, between Quebec and New Brunswick, running along the Bay of Chaleur through the thriving towns of Campbellton, Dalhousie, and Bathurst.
