THEATRICAL.—A large audience attended at the Rink Music Hall last night, attracted no doubt in part by the fact of its being Miss Webster's benefit, and in part by a desire to see Mr. Sirant Seymour's new burlesque of "Blue Beard." "Dora," a drama founded on a poem by Mr. Tennyson, took up the first part of the evening, the fair being the second act in the programme. The character of "Dora" offers peculiar difficulties to an actor. While it is sweetly pretty naturally and gracefully rendered, it lapses into mediocrity if carelessly recited or strained. The "Dora" of the poem and of the play was a sweet, simple girl, given by impulse of her own, which is lost in Miss Webster's "Dora" was hardly this, although in most instances pretty nearly approaching to it. In the emotional parts her acting was somewhat exaggerated, but on the whole we may say that we have not seen her in a part where her actress was so great. Mr. Lindley—"Sirant" Allard was not at home; he imported too much of his own peculiar line of acting into the part, and did not do the stern old farmer justice. Mr. C. J. Miers, who played "Luke Bloomfield," is deserving of credit, for although not very natural in the text, he still played naturally and with sufficient spirit to redeem him from the charge of baneness. Of "Blue Beard," which followed, we shall say but little. The time taken to prepare it for presentation was too short to enable the actors to do it or themselves justice. Besides which the members of the company lack, still more than the author, the power of the successful rendition of a musical burlesque—that is, good voices for singing. Under these circumstances it is only fair to the author to refrain from criticism, and more especially so as we have not seen the text, and our impressions of the play are only derived from the night's representation. As to the acting, we want no preparation is quite sufficient to excuse any of the fair's that were apparent, save that already alluded to. It may be mentioned that Mr. Lindley, as "no amond," (slept the fair) both as regarded his up and acting was very good. Miss Webster also played "Sister Anna" with skill and interest.
