CLUBS OF PARIS. A REVIEW OF THE "CERCLES" OF THE FRENCH METROPOLIS. (Paris Correspondence of the London Times.) A Husband, Supposed to be Dead, Turns Up After Twelve Years, and Finds His Wife Re-married.

KILLING A CINNAMON BEAR IN A CAVE. The Trinity (Cal.) Journal of February 15th relates the story of the killing of a cinnamon bear under peculiar circumstances.
