

On the bed, which occupied more than half of the miserable apartment, he discovered the body of a woman with the feet exposed, the head and the remainder of the body being covered by the bedrolothes. On removing the covering the face presented a sickening spectacle, being an advanced state of decomposition and of a dead black hue.
