Ontario Legislature. The Speaker took the chair at 3:25 p. m. After routine Mr. Crooks moved the adoption of the second report of the Committee on Private Bills.

Mr. Gibson moved, in amendment, that the report be recommitted, with instructions to consider the preamble of the bill to re-unite the North and South ridings of Huron for registration purposes.

ENGLAND. Salutes-Appointments. LONDON, March 2.-Salutes were fired on Saturday in several places, on receipt of the news of the victory in the Tiber river.

At Wardour, Wiltshire, a cannon burst, and several persons were killed and wounded. SPAIN. Embarkation-Official Reports. MADRID, March 2.-General Loma's force will embark at San Sebastian for Santander, where it will be joined by the troops under General Goyena.

FRANCE. Surrender of Bilbao. BAYONNE, March 2.-A despatch has been received by the Carlist Junta here, reporting that Bilbao has surrendered to the Royalists.

PERSONAL. Locomotive Engineers' Convention. QUINCY, Ill., March 2.-The convention of locomotive engineers adjourned this Saturday evening. It is authoritatively stated that a demand will be made upon all the roads of the West, for a reduction in the rate of wages.

QUEBEC. Court of Appeals-Transfer of Fortification Grounds-Coroner's Inquest-House on Fire. The Court of Appeals opened this morning, when Judges Leclercq and Hamay were present on the Bench.

KINGSTON. Dismissal of Officers-Races-Grand Service-Lecture. KINGSTON, March 2. A letter from the Bishop of Ontario gives great satisfaction to churchmen here, its promise to discontinue any proposition in the Synod to remove the Diocesan offices to Ottawa, and if necessary, to his residence in Kingston.

THE FLEET. Despatches from the naval fleet state that orders have been received from Washington yesterday, to continue the naval exercises until April 15. The fleet are now at sea for Key West for coal.

AMERICAN STATES. An Havana letter states the Madrid Government disapproves of Jorela's late proclamation, and will soon send Captain General Concha to resume command of the Island of Cuba.

THE GOODRICH CASE. Kate Goodrich and Lizzie King, who were arrested on the 17th inst., are now at the Kingston Jail, where they are being held for trial.

RECORDED. PHILADELPHIA, March 2.-Capt. Kelly and crew of the schooner Julia Miller, of Portland, which they had abandoned in a sinking condition, have been picked up and brought to this port.

BIRMINGHAM, March 2.-An unknown person fired a train from Philadelphia, narrowly grazing two heads. Obit. BOSTON, March 2.-James E. Libbey, journalist, and one of the former proprietors of the Courier, is dead.

AUCTION SALES. NEW YORK, March 2.-The furniture of Jay Cook a late Wall street office was auctioned off to-day, bringing twelve hundred dollars.

PROSPECTING PARTY. WASHINGTON, March 2.-General Cutler writes from Fort Lincoln that the projected prospecting expedition from Bozeman, Montana, will be undertaken.

EXPLOSION. NEW YORK, March 2.-An explosion took place at the corner of Twentieth street, at Broadway, in a toy store, this evening. The whole front was blown out, and several persons were seriously injured.

LOSSES. NEW YORK, March 2.-A despatch from Petersburg, Va., estimates the loss by fire to-day at \$40,000, insured for \$35,000.

FIRES. ST. LOUIS, March 2.-A fire to-night destroyed the Dollar Store on North Fourth street. Up to 10 o'clock the firemen were unable to extinguish the flames. Loss not known.

CUBA. Military. HAVANA, March 2.-A detachment of 300 volunteers, the first mobilized since the Captain-General's decree were issued, were to leave for the field. Two thousand more troops leave to-night for Puerto Principe.
