Close-Time for WHITE FISH. No person shall fish for, catch, kill, buy, sell, or have in possession any White Fish between the 15th day of November and the 1st day of December in each year, in the Province of Ontario.

Close-Time for BROOK or RIVER-TROUT. No person shall fish for, catch, kill, buy, sell, or have in possession any Brook or River-Trout between the 15th day of September and the 1st day of January in each year, in the Province of Ontario.

Close-Time for SALMON-TROUT, BROOK or RIVER-TROUT. No person shall fish for, catch, kill, buy, sell, or have in possession any Salmon-Trout, Brook or River-Trout between the 15th day of September and the 1st day of January in each year, in the Province of Ontario.
