A LOST GEORGIA CHILD HUNTING FOR HER PARENTS

We have received the following letter, which fully explains itself. It bears every mark of truth and sincerity, and we hope our Georgia exchanges will give it publicity:

Pittsburg, April 18, 1875.

Mr. Editor: Will you please put a notice in your paper, and have the papers of your State do the same, in regard to a child supposed to be born of Georgia parents, born in the City of Philadelphia, Pa., on the Eleventh Street Drive Arch, in the year 1850, November 23; then left in the care of Mr. John Richard H. I have a slight recollection of the gentleman who was twice a year to pay my board until I was six years and six months old; then, at seven years of age, I was taken to a boarding school. But also he had been to my school for me to see to it that I should not have ever heard tell of him since, when he would come. Mr. Thorn would often come to get some information from him. He would then say, "There is no use of your trying to find out whom the child belongs to, you may as well give up." But I am told this gentleman who I have mentioned wished to have me christened in the Episcopal Church. I do not understand what it means, unless it was to keep a clue to me. I sincerely hope I was a larger number, additional to those of mine, but help I hope, whoever she is. Mr. Editor, please send me your paper, and I should ever find out to whom I belong to, your kindness. It grieves me to know I had no one to write to, but I am sure if you can find out who I belong to, please return this letter to Mr. Wm. C. John, corner Twenty-fifth Street and Pennsylvania Avenue, Philadelphia, Pa. I have grown up to be a respectable young lady, and married to Mr. William C. John, of Pittsburg, Allegheny County, Pa. I have never seen you, but I have written with this in mind. Please send me your charges, and I will remit the same. Please answer. Yours, with respect, Miss Ida Virginia John.
