DOCKS DESTROYED.

Loss Estimated at \$300,000

ROCKLAND, June 14. The new steam saw mill of Messrs. Edwards & Co., of this place, six or seven houses, together with stables and outbuildings, and upwards of six million feet of lumber, were totally destroyed this morning by fire. Men worked with the utmost desperation, but all their efforts were in vain. The fire is said to have originated from sparks from a passing steamboat. This fine establishment, with its magnificent piling grounds and docks, covered a vast area, and is situated in the township of Clarence, on the north side of the Ottawn; River, some 20 atiles from the City of Ottawa.
