A DESTROYIVE FLOOD IN INDIANA. The Country Flooded. CANAL BROKEN AND RAILWAY TRAVEL IMPEDED. LAFAYETTE, August 3.—The flood in the Wabash is more than a foot above the high water mark of 1858, and several inches higher than ever before since the settlement of the country. All the tributaries have been running out and the low ground is all over-flooded. In many places the river is 5 to 6 miles wide. The damage is incalculable, great suffering must result to tenants in the low lands whose all is swept away. The Walnut bottoms for an average of a mile and half wide, the whole length of the river is submerged and crops both harvested and growing swept away. Our city is located on high ground, and no damage has been experienced except to manufacturing and mills. The destruction of the Wabash and Erie Canal, between here and Fort Wayne, is complete. It is broken in a hundred places. The canal and river have been on a level for forty-eight hours. The water of the river rushing through to the latter and running over the banks from one to the other at all low places. This will be a terrible blow to the people of the West, impossible to estimate any more accurately the acres submerged. The Louisville and New Albany and Chicago Railroad is much injured between here and Battle Ground. Other Railroads all right. A portion of the city located on the western bank of the Wabash has been cut off for five days by the water overflowing the bridge and levees, and communication is had by skiffs. The river has fallen about two and a half inches since seven this morning and still very slowly receding.

NEW YORK. Duncan, Sherman & Co's Insolvency. New York, August 3.—Information was received from an intimate friend of Duncan, Sherman & Co, that arrangements are in contemplation to secure all those who are indebted to the above named firm of credit and circular notes for which they have paid cash, and who have been unable to meet their obligations since the failure of the firm. Alexander, father of the late Wm. Butler Duncan, has offered to guarantee these credits of the Union Bank or some other London bank under the same conditions and it is believed that final arrangements for this purpose will be consummated to-day. Duncan stated yesterday that objection to the firm going into bankruptcy had been raised by the holders of the firm's bonds, and that the directors are endeavoring to place the affairs in the hands of assignees so that the former course would have looked up not only the assets of the firm without an opportunity of manipulating them to the best advantage of all interested parties but also a large amount of deposits that were held by the firm for safe-keeping and which are now being procured by owners simply proving property.

TELEGRAPHIC. FOREIGN. GREAT BRITAIN. The Almonst Forces Victorious—The New Spanish Constitution. LONDON, Aug. 3.—A special from Madrid to the Times says the Almonst troops continue to be successful in their operations against the Carlists. Several important towns have been gained last week. The Carlist forces are evidently approaching dissolution. General Lizaraga, with three thousand Carlists is in the citadel at San de Urdax. Spanish lands have risen owing to the improved prospect. A projected Constitution declares the State religion to be Roman Catholic. The nation is obliged to worship, so long as the respect due to Christian Monarchy is paid. Nevertheless, other public exercises or demonstrations that those of the State religion are prohibited. Canovas del Castillo, President of the Constitutional Committee, declares that the meaning of this to be that Protestants may have churches, may open doors and celebrate worship in private, but there must be no manifestations in the streets. He believed that the Cortes will be summoned to meet soon when the proposed Constitution will be ready, and consequently political agitation is recommended.
