He was in good condition, and feels confident he could have finished but for the roughness of the weather. The London Market. A special from London says, the improved tone in financial circles continues, and all fears of further depression or disaster has passed away. The market opened strong with buoyant feeling, the outlook for the near future being more hopeful than for some days past. The improvement is more marked in American Government Securities, than in any other class of values. THE ASSENT OF PRUSSIA IMPELORED TO THE GOVERNMENT OF THE CALIFORNIA AND OREGON RAILROAD. These reports prove to be extremely important. They comprise Messrs. Haswell, nominally a broker, who last year negotiated \$300,000 worth of forged bonds, and George Marshall, who is considered the most important man in a gang of bond counterfeiters who, through the endeavours of the late Sir John A. Macdonald, were arrested in New York. These are some of the persons who negotiated the bonds, which are believed to be worthless. The statement of the firm of Dunsmuir, Sherman & Co. shows their liabilities to be \$1,121,120, assets, \$2,112,740. Mr. Dunsmuir explained that the statement is not official, and can be taken as representing only the approximate amount. He enquired that he was daily made regarding the probable condition of affairs of the firm, and with special care to avoid giving out any information which might be justified by final results. All doubtful assets have been reduced or entirely given up. The amount of liabilities is \$1,121,120. The amount of assets is \$2,112,740. THE NEW FREIGHT TARIFF. The new freight tariff to the west, an advance on previous rates, goes into operation this morning over the four trunk lines, the New York Central, Erie, Pennsylvania and Baltimore and Ohio.
