THE PERILS OF PANAMINT VALLEY-TERRIBLE DEATH OF A YOUNG MAN. From the Panamint News.

Either last Saturday or Sunday four men, Quigley, Grant, Phillips and a colthey had been prospecting, to go to Lookout district, across Papamint valley. It appears from the report brought us by J. Davidson, who heard a portion from the survivors of the party, and was an eve witness to the balance of the story, that this party had plenty of water on Monday up to noon, about two and a half pints each, but the hot-blowing winds of the valley soon caused them to suffer exceedingly. The colored man was the first to succumb. He was told by Phillips, who is an old mountaineer, to lie down and keep quiet, and the rest of them would go on to the water and return for him. The other three started on, and Phillips to go back where the colored man was and he did so.

Phillips and Quigley had not gone far when the latter said he felt sick, and could go no further. He, too, was told by Phillips to lie down and he would go for who went to Darwin canon, where he ob tained water, but he was delayed about one hour and a half longer than he expected to be. He immediately started to return, but on arriving at the place where he left Quigley he could not find him although he hallooed for him a number of times.
