DR. TAYLOR IN SCOTLAND. Lecture on Canada. Aberdeen Ffee Press, Dec. 11 The Rev. Lachlin Taylor, D.D., of Toronto, delivered a lecture in the ball-

room, Music Hall Buildings, on Friday evening the subject being "The Dominion of Canada; its extent, soil, climate, commercial and agricultural resources, and its adaption as a home for the industrious landless people of this country." Lord Provost Jamieson presided, and after prayer, introduced the lecturer. After J. D. Buell, M. P., elected Mayor—167 speaking of the importance of the British colonies, Dr. Taylor went on to say that Canada is over three million square miles in extent, an area almost equal to the John N. Tuttle, Reeve; Councillors of the Hudson's Bay Company since the time of Charles I. I have travelled five months over its prairies and meadows, rich with verdure, the best pasture in the world, and I was delighted all that time Atlantic in calm weather, which is allowed to be a most delightful experience, well I cannot compare the prairie to anything but a sea of waving verdure. From this great rich territory Britain will draw her resources in the future.
