WAINRIGHT, THE MURDERER OF HARRIET

LANE, HANGED IN AN ORDERLY MANNER. From the Lon Ison Star durd, of Dec. '2. Yesterday morning at 8 o'clock, Henry Wainright suffered death at the hands of the common haugman, in atonement of his crime. It is unnecessary now to rec pitulate the shocking details which successive exhaustive enquiries have revealed, respecting the crime for which this man was punished. It is therefore sufficient to state that nothing occurred since the death sentence was passed to induce the authorities in the slightest deree to modify their opinion that Henry Wainwright was the murderer of the unfortunate woman, Harriet Lane.
