A verdict was given in favour of Eliza Benson for \$4,200, against the Philadelphia and Reading Railway Company, last week, for having taken her beyond a stated station. The company has moved for a new trial.

A number of leading hotels at Orchard Beach, some distance from Portland, in the State of Maine, have been burned. The loss is estimated at \$15,000. The fire is supposed to be of incendiary.
