Ontario Legislature.

Third Parliament—First Session.
After the presentation of some petitions, it was moved by Hon. Mr. Coxworth that the Legislature be adjourned until the 11th inst.
Hon. Mr. Macdonnell moved an amendment in effect that the sale of liquors in shops be confined to such shops as will sell only the best quality of spirits.

LONDON.

London, Feb. 7.—Annals Talbot and Hattie O'Connell, charged with robbing a female companion named Rebecca Flynn, of cash and papers to the amount of \$250, have been committed for trial, bail being refused.

MONTREAL.

Montreal, Feb. 7.—To-day, in the Worn's case, Justice Ramsay gave judgment on the application of Mr. Kerr, Q.C., to bring witnesses for the prosecution from Philadelphia, allowing him to do so, and granting a remand of the prisoner for that purpose.

TORONTO.

Toronto, Feb. 7.—Yesterday Archbishop Lynch announced in St. Michael's Cathedral that tickets certifying to the date of performance of the pilgrimages of Canada, and only very recently those of Ottawa, gave another very successful entertainment in the Opera House last evening.

GERMANY.

Berlin, Feb. 7.—The Sublime Porte's circular in regard to the reforms promised in the Northern Provinces mentions as the basis of its design not only the negotiations with Austria, Russia, and Germany, but also the support of the schemes by other guaranteeing powers.

SPANAIN.

Madrid, Feb. 7.—It is stated that the Bishop and Navarre Provincial Deputies have told Don Carlos not to expect any further aid from them.
