AMERICAN COMMERCIAL CANADIAN.

THE MARKET.

There was a fair attendance at this market yesterday, prices holding firm at previous quotations. Hay was sold at high as \$2 and as low as \$1 1/2 per ton. Neither of these prices, however, can be taken as the standard, which was about \$1 1/2. Prime butter continues to sell here at 28c per pound, but 24c is the general price obtained. Eggs were plentiful, and sold from 12c to 14c per dozen. Vegetables, roots, and grains sold at nominal figures.

There was a good attendance of sellers here yesterday, but a very meagre turnout of buyers, and consequently little or no business transacted. Old prices, however, were maintained, it being considered that everything just now is about as cheap as it can be, and that in regard to the rules in this respect good quotations of which were sold as high as \$1 1/2 per ton. All other quotations remain as before.
