LOCAL NEWS.

POLICE COURT YESTERDAY.

WEDNESDAY, Sept. 6. Before M. O'GARA, P. M. Maurice Livet and Benjamin Beaucare were charged with fighting and disturbing the peace in the saloon of the latter on Tuesday. Livet was drinking, got drunk, and grew quarrelsome in his cups, which it seems Beaucare did not resist; for it is all very well to spend money, but to quarrel, especially when the case is gone, is quite a different thing. He therefore proceeded to eject his customer, and a fight was the result. Livet said the hotel-keeper kicked him out; but Beaucare denied it, and said he only pushed him out with his foot, "a little strong."

The better to illustrate his ineffective way of doing the thing, he raised his foot in Court, and moved it gently forward, but could not do away with the impression that he actually did kick him, and so he was sentenced to pay a fine of \$2 and costs.

WILLIAM ROBERTSON was found drunk on the streets, between the hours of one and two o'clock yesterday morning. He could not account for his being asleep, and was fined \$2 and costs.

THOMAS TAYLOR was charged with assaulting himself by kicking N. Mathew, and jumping on his body when a severe witness was called for the defence, but he had to pay the usual fine of \$2 and costs.

EUGENE BEAUCARE, son of the saloon-keeper, was charged with assaulting his father, on Tuesday morning. He wanted a quarter to get his hair cut, and when refused he demanded a drink. This reasonable request having been also refused, Beaucare flew into a rage, and struck his father with a bottle. Beaucare was striven to prevent him, hence the assault. Eugene said he was entitled to something, as he gave his father all the money he earned up the river during the summer—\$5 and costs.

ANOTHER CASE OF ASSAULT. William Heilly charged William O. St. George with assaulting him when he went to transact some business with him. Heilly told his wrongs in very eloquent and pathetic language, while the defendant could not say a word, so strong was indignation. Defendants in fact are generally indignant while plaintiffs are testifying, and look up towards heaven in a most appealing way, as if calling down fire. Heilly said he had a cut on his head, but when His Worship wished to examine its dimensions, he could not find it after careful examination. He was, however, fined \$1 and costs, after satisfying himself a little by saying that Heilly was constantly drunk.

THOMAS TAYLOR was brought up for obtaining a suit of clothes from J. O. Smith, Druggist, on Wednesday. He admitted in defence that he intended to pay when his remittance came from England. The Magistrate advised the parties to settle, and would give them a day to do so. Mrs. Burns, charged with larceny, case dismissed.
