CONNECTICUT.

Munities of War for Turkey. NEW HAVEN, Dec. 28.—The steamship King Arthur sailed hence to-day for Constantinople with munitions of war for the Turkish Government as follows: 10,080,000 cartridges, 10,000,000 bullets, 10,000,000 Martini Henry shells, 40,000 guns, 60,000 scabbards, 50,000,000 gloves, and 45 packages of miscellaneous merchandise. The total value of cargo is \$1,344,000.

The Least Question.
