



Dr. Rowbotham says it is difficult to avoid the conclusion that Phosphorus in a free, unoxidated state is an essential element of acoxidated state is an essential element of activity in the prain and nervous system of animals; it is equally difficult to resist the conviction of the great importance of Phosphorons as an element of the Materia Medica.

The question naturally presents itself, "Why is so valuable an element so little regarded and so seldom prescribed?" The enly answer which can be given is:—that a certain difficulty has been found in so preparing it that its action may be kept under perfect control. Hitherto it has been used in almond and olive oils, in Sulphuric Ether, in rectified
