At Les Petits Anges nursery school

Even the talking dolls speak French

At Penetanguishene's Les Petits Anges Nursery School, even the talking dolls speak French. There are 33 youngsters in the area's only French nursery school. Five of them are from Midland. Parents see the experience as valuable preparation for possible entry into the area's French elementary school, St. Joseph's in Penetanguishene.

The little Angels meet in three groups of approximately ten children in morning and afternoon sessions on Monday and Tuesday, and on Thursday mornings and Friday afternoons. The locale, in St. Ann's church basement, provides plenty of open space for play and smaller rooms for cosier activities.

Teachers for the cooperative school, which is licensed under the Ministry of Community and Social Services, are Celine Leblanc and Mary Anne Sauve, and conversation is in French wherever possible. They are not rigid about it, however, and if an English-speaking mother is present, the atmosphere is likely to be bilingual.
French nursery schools at Perkinsfield and Lafontaine

have been discontinued because funding collapsed. Money for Les Petits Anges school comes through fees (\$12 monthly) and a government grant, which has been approved although the money hasn't arrived yet. When it does, fees will be lowered to \$6 a month. Meanwhile, the mothers of the angels raise money to buy equipment and supplies, and to pay the teachers.

The operation was begun and initially funded by the Centre D'Activites Francaises.

Although in only its second year of operation, the nursery school is well equipped. There are lots of tricycles for big muscle activities, and an indoor slide, complete with a mattress at the landing point. There are hammers and nails for miniature carpenters, a well equipped

homemaking centre and a glorious collection of dress-up clothes.

There are puzzles and story books and a number of battery operated toys that speak French. "Le chat fait 'Meow'. Le mouton fait 'Ba-a'", says one.
At singing time, the children enjoy action songs and subliminally increase their vocabularies.

Because most of the youngsters come from Anglophone homes, story time is presently in English, but there is a collection of French story books, like "Porcelet Explorateur," awaiting the time when all the angels are comfortable in their new language.

Nursery school policies and plans are overseen by a board of directors - Joan Northcott, Roland Desroches, Jane Magnan, Carole Sauve and Joanne

Borley. The executive of Carol Gerow, Barbara Desroches, Joanne Borley, Bev Hewitt, Brigitte Thomas, and Anna Charron, is planning the first Petit Anges fund raising project - a dance at Midland's Civic Centre (the old Armouries building) on February 7. Tickets for the dance, which features John Coull's PSS Swing Band, are available from Zeller's, Gerow's Flower Barn, Wally's Men's Wear, Lafontaine Cooperative, Shoppe 27, Ted Light's TV and Le Centre D'Activites Francaises.

Proceeds from the dance will fatten the nursery school treasury so that les petits anges may have a continuing supply of play materials and equipment, and also to fly out on special field trips and excursions.
