

Teresa Howe dead at 94

Teresa Howe died on February 2, 1975 at the Penetanguishene General Hospital after a brief illness. She was 94 years old.

Born in Penetanguishene on July 4, 1880 to Isaac and Catherine (Callaghan) Howe (both deceased) she spent all her life in this area at what is known as Howe's Corners, Vinden Street and Highway 27. Her last few years however, were spent at Georgian Manor.

Funeral services were held at St. Ann's Church on February 5, 1975 with Father L. Dignard presiding. Burial took place at St. Ann's Cemetery, Penetanguishene.


