Championship Game Base Borden 1 Saltfleet 2

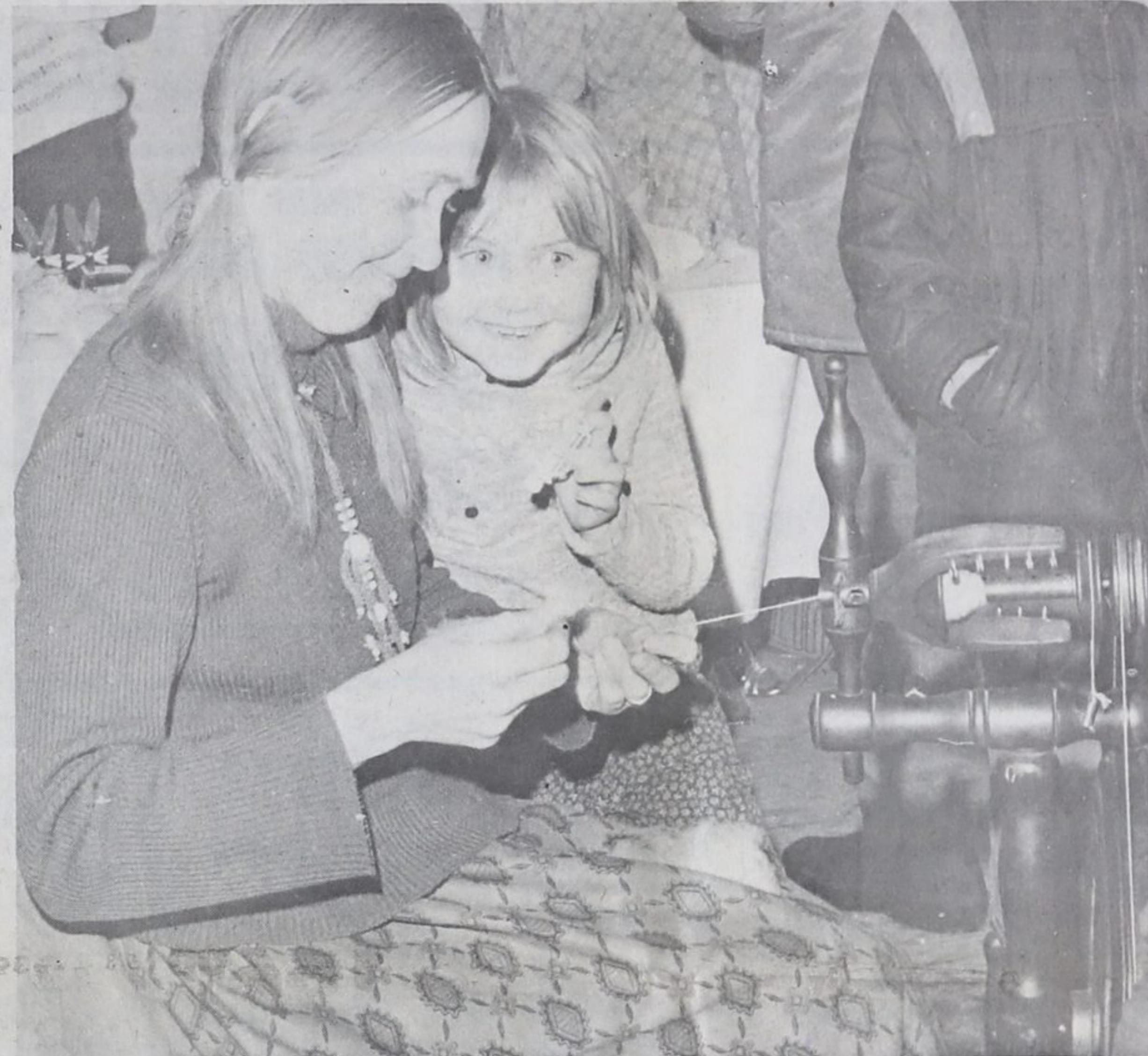
The closest and most exciting game of the Penetanguishene Winterama Atom Hockey Tournament was saved for the

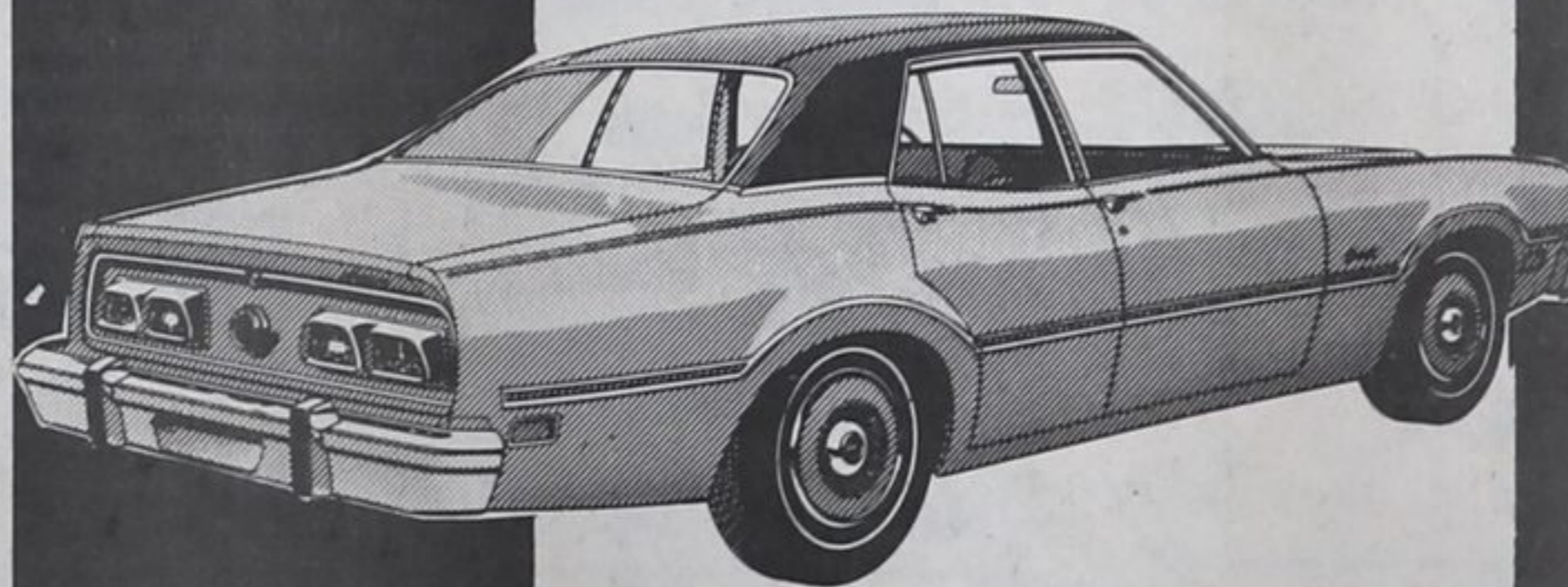
