Penetanguishene General Hospital's Board of Directors held its annual meeting last Thursday evening and all present shared the conviction that the past year had been a good year.

The members of the board were told that trends within the hospital were moving in the directions the Ministry of Health has advocated in order to keep costs down. The length of the average length of a patient's stay was down by three and a half per cent in 1974 to 9.03 days. At the same time the number of outpatients had risen dramatically. The number of outpatient visits in the emergency department had risen by 40 per cent while those in the radiology increased by 19 per cent; the laboratory by five per cent. and by 31 per cent in the physiotherapy department.
