Waubushene Anglican Guild

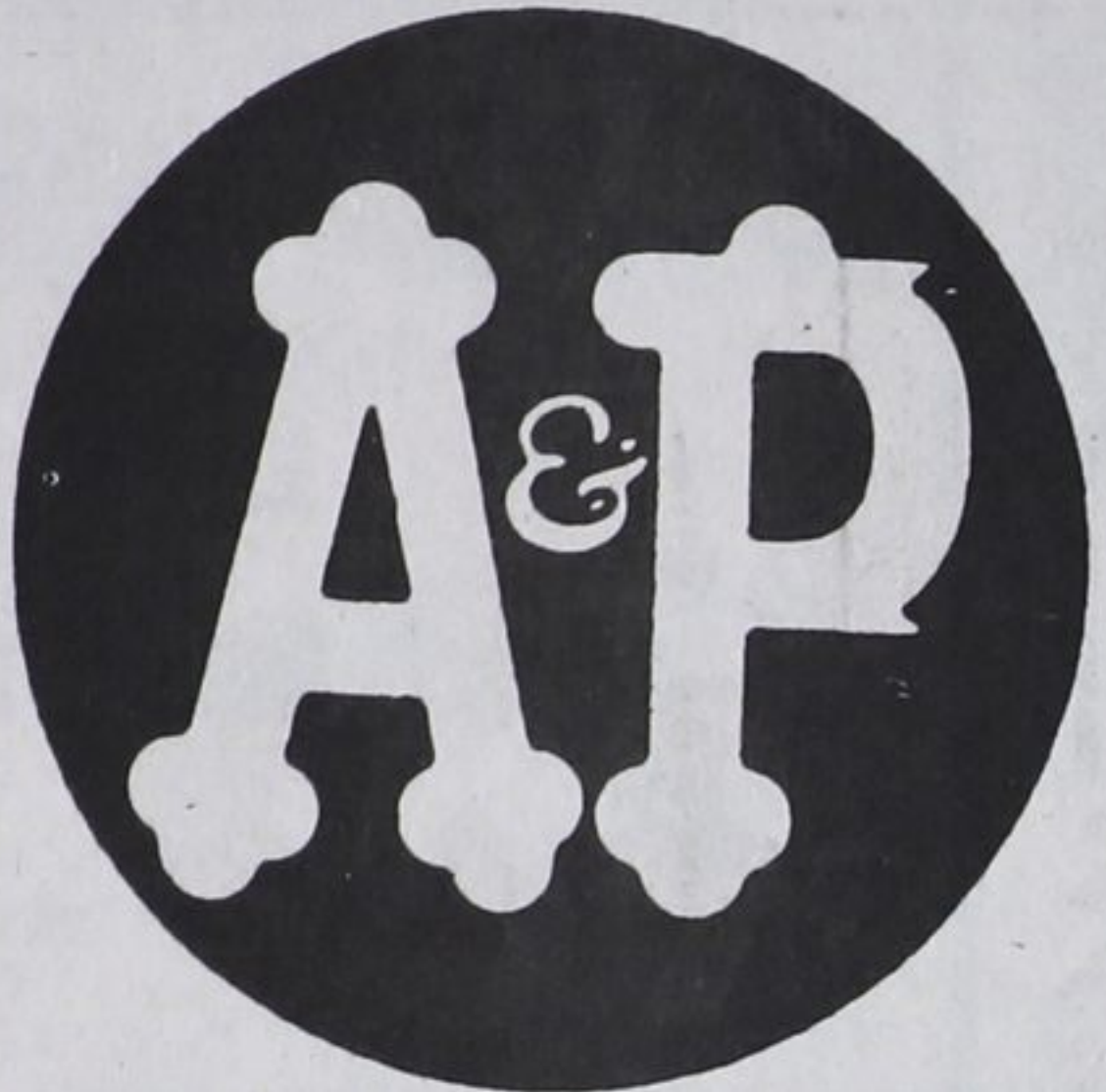
