Bursary fund underway

Letters were mailed near the end of last week, and by Monday the Midland and Penetanguishene Scholarship Fund had already started receiving cheques for this year's bursaries.

The fund relies upon local businesses, industries, organizations, and private citizens to make "graduation a meaningful part of the student's lives" by acknowledging their achievements and triumphs, with the hope that the money will be applied to further studies.

Many industries like to donate one lump sum, head of guidance at PSS, and the school's representative for the fund. As a result, the joint committee was established 10 years ago and the collected money is split on a per capita basis between the Penetanguishene and Midland Secondary Schools.

Last year, the students had about 90 benefactors contributing \$4,492 to reward scholastic achievement and improvement throughout the school year. Approximately one quarter of the money given to 250 students in sums from \$10 to \$150 was donated by the teachers. The largest single contributor is the Town of Penetanguishene with \$450.

The scholarship committee allots the funds to the various departments according to size, and the department heads and teachers decide upon the individual winners.

"We like to see the little guy get it too," said Paille, and as a result some awards are for things like greatest improvement, rather than just high marks.



First donation made

According to George Bryant it is a good idea to donate a little to help out the students with an incentive. DECISION

Ottawa, April 11, 1975

The Canadian Radio-Television Commission announces the following decisions relating to applications for cable television fee increases in Ontario and Quebec. These applications were heard at the Public Hearings held in Toronto, Number 26, 1974, in Montreal, December 10, 1974, and in Toronto, February 25, 1975. In considering these applications, the Commission has been guided by the criteria outlined in its Public Announcement of September 18, 1974. In particular, the Commission has, except in exceptional circumstances, adopted the concept of regional uniformity of fee structure and has approved fee increase applications up to a level which the Commission considers is sufficient for the provision of cable television service in each region.

Application by Maclean-Hunter Cable TV Limited to amend its cable television broadcasting licence for Midland and Penetanguishene, Ont. to change its fee structure as follows:

Monthly fee - \$5.25

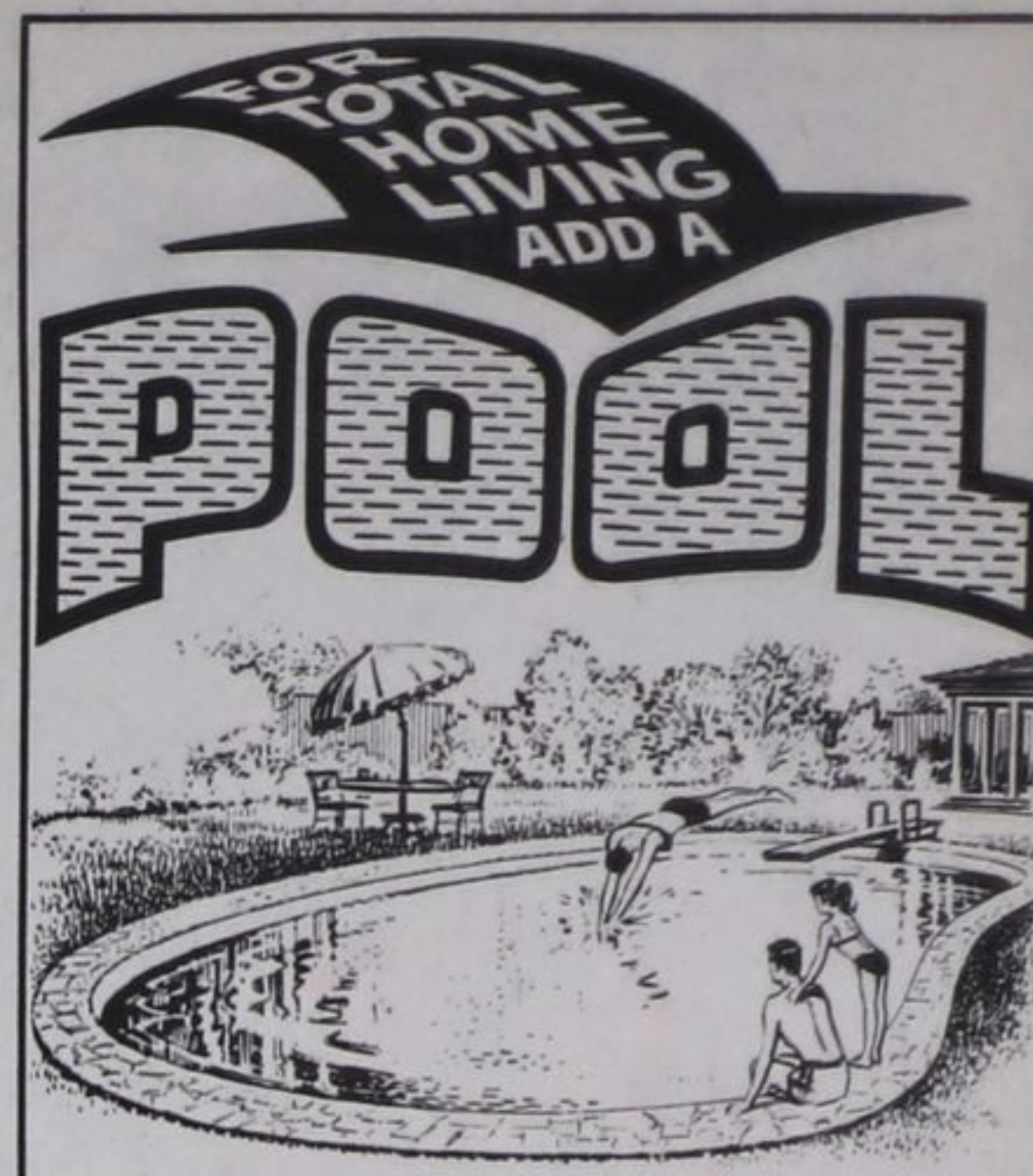
DECISION: APPROVED

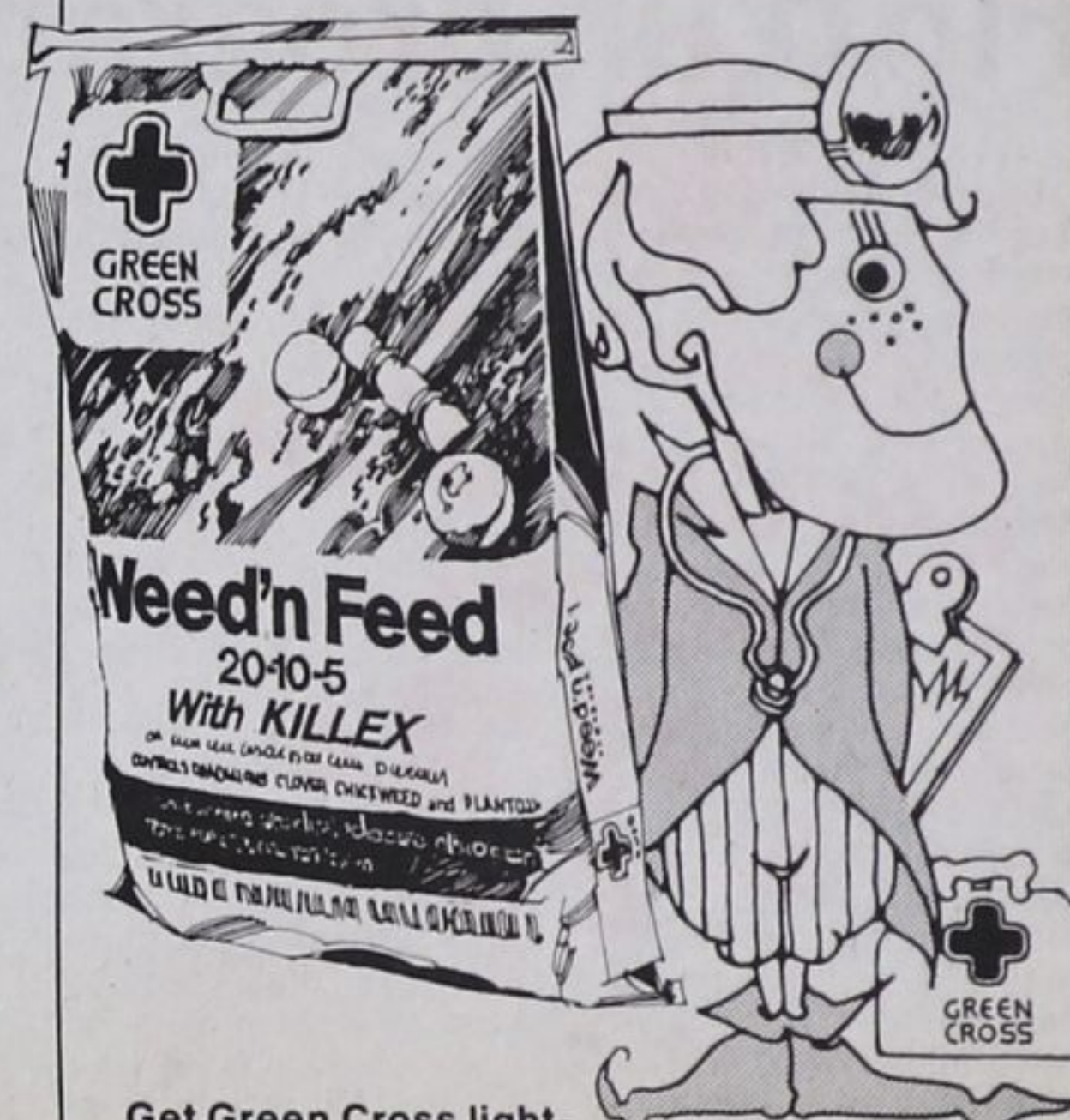

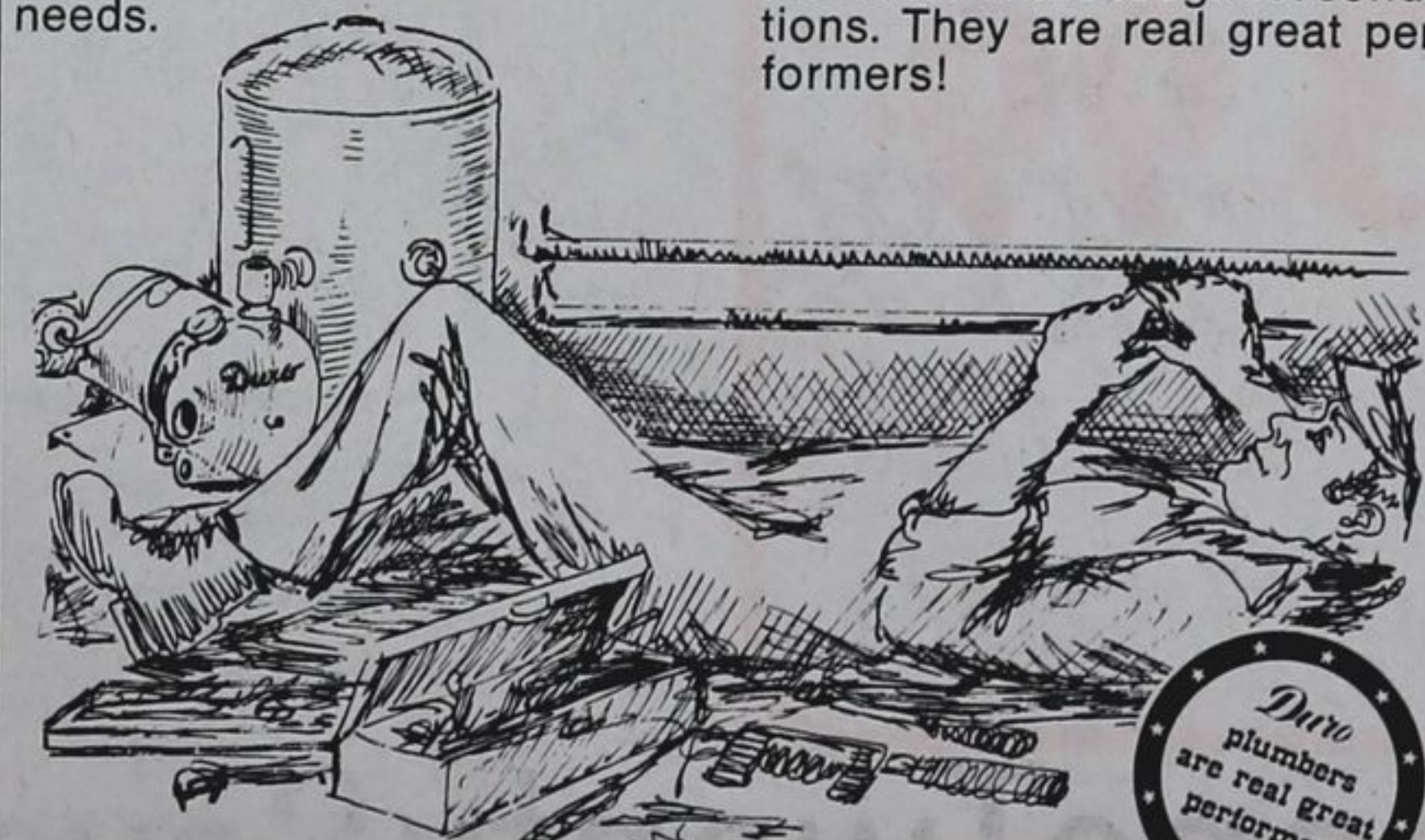

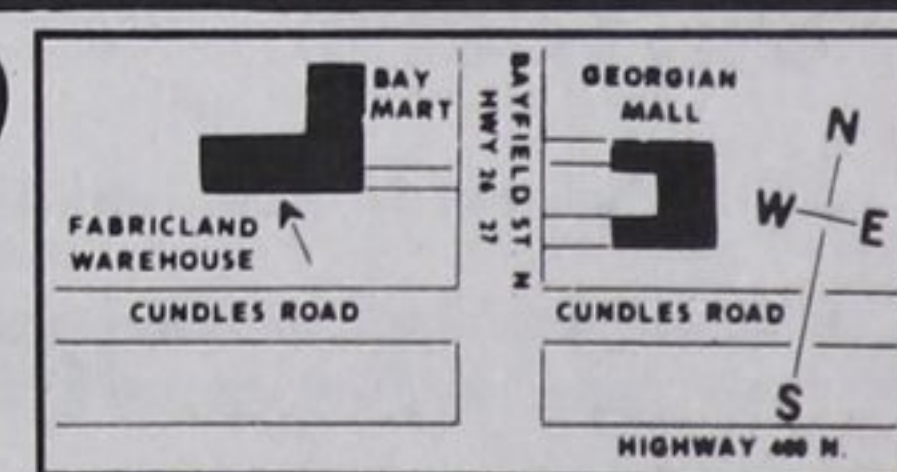
