French night classes okayed for St. Joseph's

A night school, in which the language of instruction is French, will be set up for the school year 1975-76 at St. Joseph's Public School in Penetanguishene.

The Simcoe County Board of Education last week accepted a recommendation to establish the courses, which will be organized to last for ten weeks before Christmas, with another set of courses of ten weeks duration beginning in January.

The purpose of the night school is to enable families to improve their use of the French language through classes held in a variety of subjects, in which French is the language of instruction.

According to director of education Jack Ramsay, a report on the success of the night school will be given during the year. To start the course, the board would accept 15 as a reasonable number, he said, but sometimes a course may start with less than that number, in order to get the program off the ground.

A principal would be required to handle the organization and administration of the school and to obtain the necessary instructors. Area superintendent A.J. Gardhouse suggested that a member of St. Joseph's be appointed as principal.

A former United Church, the building was struck by fire about a year ago. Since then, Sacred Heart parishioners worshipped at the Bonar Presbyterian Church, at the invitation of Rev. Al Farthing and his congregation.

What began as a disaster appeared to have united the people of the parish more than ever, Rev. Fulton noted in his address to the assembly. He pointed to the dedicated work of Rev. W. Vincent Egan, pastor of Sacred Heart Church, and those who were involved in the rebuilding project, as a large factor behind the undertaking.

Father Egan, who will soon be celebrating 40 years as a priest, described the project as "most rewarding, although tiring at times." He expressed his appreciation of the people who supported the project, and helped turn a tragedy into something "worthwhile and long-lasting".
