Penetanguishene S.S. music students please audiences

John Coull and his Penetanguishene Secondary School music students demonstrated the energy, variety and talent inherent in their school music program last Wednesday night with their annual spring concert.

The junior band opened the evening with a collection of pieces by

Handel, Raposo, Bach, Giraud, Bacharach and Dvorak. These youngsters, most of

whom have had only eight months experience on their instruments, played with great concentration

and care. The members of the junior band are a well disciplined group, attentive to the direction of their leader. Senior band members will graduate, but their places will be capably filled by these excellent young musicians.

The second half of Wednesday night's concert was given over to the seniors. Two of their numbers, Westward Ho (Johnston) and Jazz Suite (Mersey) have been included in the long-

playing record which is in production and due to go on sale soon. Soloist Pierre Lefave — a scholarship winner in the '75 music festival — performed commendably with the band in Sorrento (de Curtis) and three members of the trombone section, Tom Payne, John Paille and Ken Marchildon, were featured in Swinging Sides (Butts). Paul Robillard, a PSS band alumnus, was guest conductor for one number. Paul is presently a bachelor of music student at Queen's University.

The senior band played with great enthusiasm, and John Coull has taught these young people a great deal about the joy of music. Sandwiched between performances by the junior and senior bands was a jumping mini-concert by the celebrated PSS Swing Band. They too are featured on the record. Wednesday night they played Dorsey's Getting Sentimental Over You, Begin the Beguine, The Way We Were and Basie's Tater Patch. Judy Campell was the vocalist.

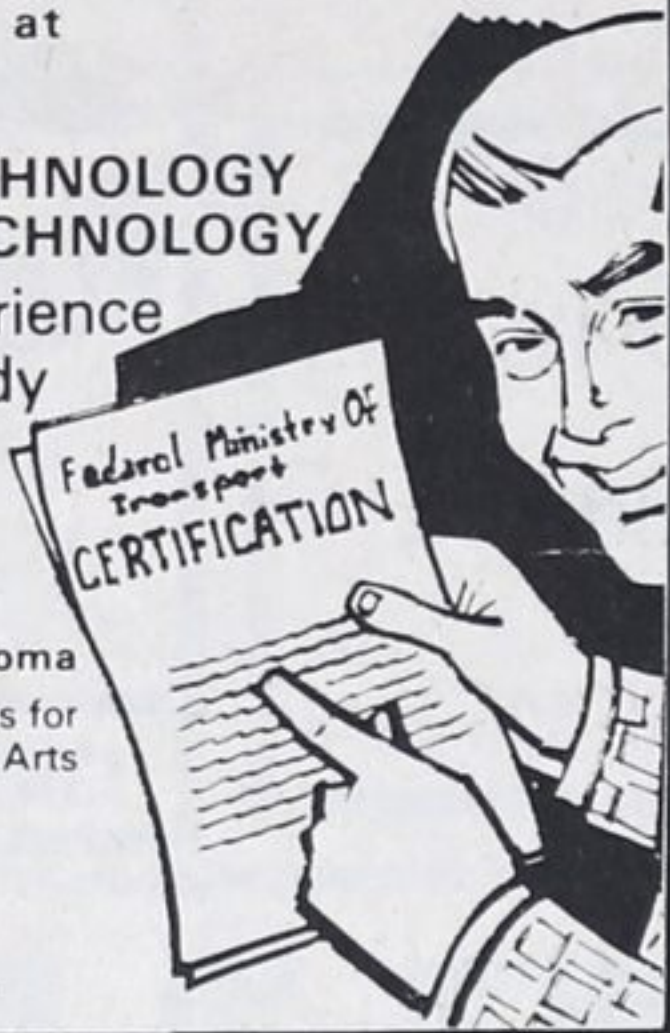

How do TV signals get to Midland-Penetanguishene?

TV signals for the cable system are received through the air at the Maclean-Hunter Cable TV receiving site on Balm Beach Road.

Signals received by this means from more than 75 miles are usually unreliable and of poor quality.

The receiving antennas used are the largest and most sophisticated in use for this purpose in Canada.

What can be done to improve the TV signals in the Midland-Penetanguishene Area?

1. The Toronto TV stations (5, 19, 25) will be moving to the CN tower in the spring of 1976. This will increase the strength of the signals available in Midland.
2. Maclean-Hunter Cable TV has applied to the Canadian Radio-Television Commission for permission to microwave from Buffalo to Midland channels 2, 4, and 17.
