

1. The Corporation of the Town of Penetanguishene has constructed as a Local Improvement a Sanitary Sewer on the following

2. The cost of the work is \$66,500.00 of which \$25,595.00 is to be paid by the Corporation. The special rate per foot frontage is \$14.81 if paid by cash. The Special Assessment may be paid in 20 equal instalments of approximately \$34.79 per foot, including estimated interest on debentures.

3. The estimated lifetime of the work is 40 years.
