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Construction pace pleases High Point Mall builder

Although construction on the High Point Mall started two months later than anticipated, the mall will be finished by the originally scheduled target date of sometime in November according to developer-owner Jack Anthony.

Anthony made the statement during a visit to the High Point Mall site on Monday. He said that a retainer wall at the west end of the mall had been one of the main reasons for the delay. But that wall and an additional fire corridor are presently going up. His partner, Tony Breda said that the west side of the mall had to be redesigned because the earth embankment in that area was higher than originally expected. And he added that an additional fire corridor being built at the west end of the mall was something else which had not been in the original plans for that

area of the mall. These two changes caused roughly a month delay in construction Breda estimated.

Now that demolition of Ted Light's old TV store and the Maytag Laundromat has been completed and construction started, Anthony indicated that he was optimistic concerning the success of the mall development.

People would start believing in the mall he said. He added that he expected the mall, which will contain over 20 stores, to be nearly filled when it opens. One, two or three stores may be unoccupied when the mall opens he said.

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Industry show canned

The future of a proposed one day industrial show by area industries on July 28 is no longer up in the air. It has been cancelled.

Hans Rick, the man responsible for co-ordinating the show on behalf of the Penetanguishene Chamber of Commerce recently indicated that the future of the show was in doubt because the response from area industries was less than encouraging.

Now Rick says that he has asked the president of the Chamber of Commerce to cancel the show. Rick said that the people who are supposed to be organizing the show are too involved in other things to hold it in July. And he added that the concept of a one day show was not a feasible one. In order for industries to make the investment of putting up a display practical, Rick said that it would have to be something in the order of a week long event. To hold a show of that length at the Waterfront Community Centre would be impossible because the Centre does not have a free week this summer.

However, while an industrial show will not take place this summer, Rick said that the idea is a good one and it may be tried next year.

(Local Improvement Act, Section 43, Form 4)

TAKE NOTICE THAT:-

- The Corporation of the Town of Penetanguishene has constructed as a Local Improvement a Sanitary Sewer on the following streets:-
Poyntz Street from Centre Street to John Street;
Centre Street from Robert Street West to Poyntz Street;
Poyntz Lane from Scott Street to John Street;
John Street from Robert Street West to Poyntz Lane.
- The cost of the work is \$66,500.00 of which \$25,595.00 is to be paid by the Corporation. The special rate per foot frontage is \$14.81 if paid by cash. The Special Assessment may be paid in 20 equal instalments of approximately \$34.79 per foot, including estimated interest on debentures.
- The estimated lifetime of the work is 40 years.
- A Court of Revision will be held on June 27th, 1975 at 10:30 o'clock A.M., at the Municipal Office, 10 Robert St. W., Penetanguishene, for the purpose of hearing complaints against the proposed assessments or the accuracy of frontage measurements and any other complaint that persons interested may desire to make and that is by law cognizable by the Court.
