### Midland provincial court news

# Jolie pleads guilty to forging a \$100 cheque

Ronald G. Jolie, 19, Bourke Street, Penetanguishene was convicted in provincial court in Midland on Monday for false pretense, forgery, and attempted uttering, and remanded for sentencing until June 30.

Charged by the Midland detachment of the Ontario Provincial Police on April 2, 1975, Jolie pleaded guilty to writing a cheque for which there was no existing bank account.

On April 11, Jolie was charged with forging the signature on a cheque in the amount of \$100, which he cashed at the Midland General Store, King Street, Midland.

Jolie was charged on April 17 with uttering a forged document when he presented a cheque at the Midland Home Hardware store, endorsed with his forged signature. Jolie was convicted on the lesser charge of attempting uttering.

Sentencing will take place on June 30, pending receipt by the court of a pre-sentence report.

Conditional discharge Thomas G. Anderson, 21, 42 Elizabeth Street, Midland was granted a conditional discharge by provincial court judge

L.T. Montgomery on a charge of public mischief in Midland court on Monday.

Charged by the Penetanguishene Town Police on May 29, 1975 following the wilful damage of a door glass at the Commodore Hotel, Anderson was ordered by the court to repay the \$30 damage and placed on six months probation.

Absolute discharge granted

Two Port McNicoll youths, who describe themselves as "good friends" were granted an absolute discharge on charges of creating a public disturbance by provincial judge L.T. Montgomery in Midland court on Monday morning.

Gerard R. Smith, 18, McNicoll Street, Port McNicoll and David Jones, 17, Concession 4, Port McNicoll were charged by Penetanguishene police following a fight outside the Commodore Hotel in Penetanguishene on May

30, 1975 at 11:50 p.m.

Judge Montgomery described the incident as "childish conduct" on the part of the two youths. Taking into consideration the fact that neither had a criminal record, he granted both youths an absolute discharge.

Car theft conviction Two Penetanguishene youths have been remanded until July 7, 1975 for sentencing following their conviction of a charge of auto theft in Midland provincial court on Monday morning.

Michael Bechard, 21, of 65 Bourke Street, Penetanguishene and Gary Douglas Joseph Belcourt, 20, of 66 Water Street, Penetanguishene were charged by Penetanguishene police on Sunday, April 27, 1975 for the theft of a vehicle, owned by Margaret Ruth.

Considering that Bechard had already been convicted on one charge of joyriding on February 10, 1975, judge L.T. Montgomery asked that a pre-sentenced report of both men be

compiled for the court's consideration.

Sentenced to six months John Perrault, 16, of Princess Street, Midland was sentenced to serve six months definite and three months indeterminate on a conviction of break, enter, and theft and sentenced to serve two months concurrently on a charge of joyriding in provincial court in Midland on Monday.

Judge L.T. Montgomery handed down the sentence on the basis of what was described by defense attorney John Gammell as an "unfavourable" pre-sentence report and Perrault's previous record.

The 16-year-old youth has been given an opportunity in the past to rehabilitate himself, Montgomery noted, but does not seem to have much respect for the law "unfortunately".

"Sometimes getting a boy over the hurdle into

adulthood means the court must give him a good push", the judge added.

The deterrent aspect of the sentence must be considered, and the court would be "remiss not to consider a period of incarceration".

Denied bail A 17-year-old Midland youth pleaded guilty in Midland court on Monday to two counts of uttering, one charge of break, enter, and theft, one count for breach of an undertaking, to one charge of assault.

Denied bail, Wayne Contois, of 318 Princess Street, Midland, will remain in custody until the court receives a pre-sentence report later this month.

Fined \$200 Douglas Diver, 25, of Midland was fined \$200 in Midland court on Monday on a conviction of impaired driving. The

conviction automatically carries with it a suspension of the driver's licence.

Diver was charged by

Midland police on May 11, 1975 when a breathalyzer test revealed 200 mg. of alcohol in his bloodstream.
