After the summer break in the fall of 1974, we made arrangements with the Brooklea Golf Club to host our luncheons where they have continued

from October to the present. The date is always the third Wednesday of each month. We have a different chairman each month, one of our excellent community leaders who attend regularly. The chairman asks for announcements of any special event to share with other services and the introduction of new peoples is another important aspect. Each month one service has the opportunity to present their work and purpose, a question answer

period follows. We are happy with the fact that this opportunity for people in service to people, meeting regularly, has contributed to greater understanding of each other and to stronger inter agency relationships.


