

## Town police

Despite the influx of tourists and the carnival atmosphere of centennial celebrations, there were not any major law and order problems during the first half of Old Home Week. Police Chief John Geere claims that Penetanguishene's centennial week celebrations haven't given the town force any extra problems.

### Charged with mischief

A 47-year-old Penetanguishene man was charged with mischief to private property following an incident at the Brule Hotel last Thursday night around 11:30 p.m.

David Edward Crane is being held responsible for damaging the door at the Brule Hotel. Police estimate the damage at \$35.

### Hot car burned

A 1971 Chev was discovered burned to a crisp, east of Fuller Avenue in Tay Township, by the Ontario Provincial Police late last Friday night. The car had been stolen from Timothy Adams of RR 1 Midland Point.

Police list the car as a total write-off. An investigation into the case continues.

### Tire slasher strikes

Someone slashed two tires on a car which was parked in the Post Office parking lot. The incident occurred late Friday night or early Saturday morning. The car belonged to Clair Marchildon of Tiny Township. Total value of the tires was estimated at \$60. by police.

## OPP report

The Midland detachment of the Ontario Provincial Police escaped the holiday weekend with a relatively light work load, despite record crowds that jammed area beaches in the 80 degree weather.

The men had a total of 15 accidents and 102 general occurrences to investigate between Friday evening and Tuesday morning, but most were of a minor nature — including a raft of noisy parties and liquor violations.

### Coldwater man in mishap

A 34-year-old Coldwater man escaped injury Friday evening when his car went out of control on Highway 12 near the west junction of Port McNicoll Road about 6:30 p.m. An OPP spokesman said the car, owned and driven by David Archer, suffered an estimated \$300 damage when it struck a highway sign. The sign was damaged to the tune of \$30. No charges were laid.

### The night prowlers

Most area boaters believe the OPP's patrol cruiser General Williams and its 18-foot sidekick runabout go home when the sun goes down, leaving the waters of Georgian Bay an unpoliced playground.

But as a group of young Midland district men discovered early Sunday morning there is little truth and a lot of fiction in that belief.

Officers Ron Rowe and Peter Scanlan pulled over a boat travelling with insufficient lights at 12:30 a.m. near Little Dog Channel off Beausoleil Island, and by the time the incident ended four men had been charged with offences ranging from impaired operation of a boat to assaulting police, resisting arrest, and possessing liquor in a place other than a residence.

A police spokesman said a scuffle broke out when they stopped the boat. Michael Paul Dusome, 23, of Midland is charged with Liquor Control Act violations, having no running lights on a vessel, and assaulting police. Roger Dusome, 20, of Midland and Ronald Gravelle, of R.R. 2 Penetanguishene have been charged with assault, while Ronald Gravelle has been charged with impaired boating and resisting arrest.
