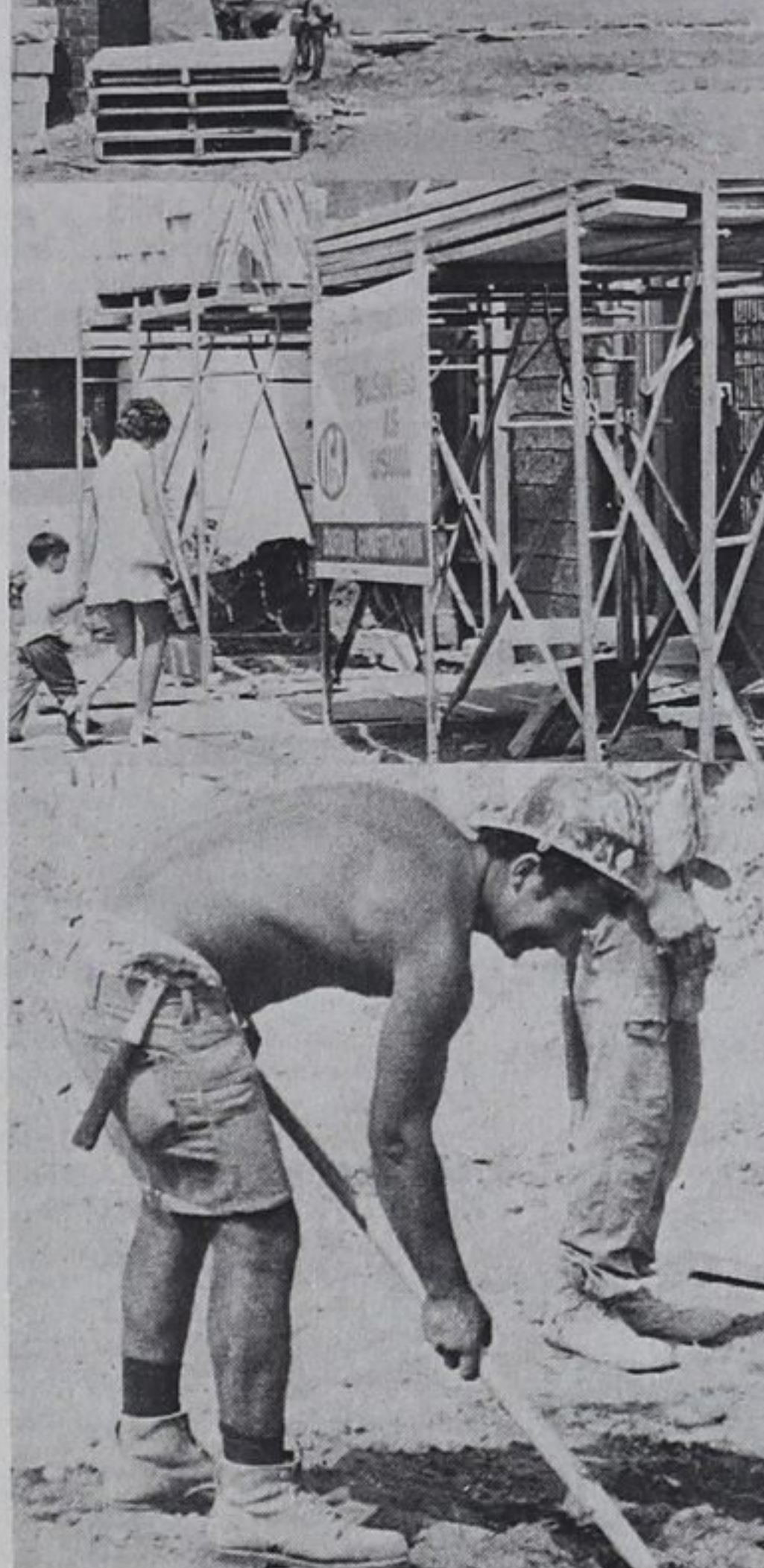
The mall begins to take shape
