## 50 area Witnesses go to meeting

Midland — A series of over one hundred conventions of Jehovah's Witnesses is scheduled this summer in the United States and Canada. Arthur Allison,

spokesman for the Midland Congregation, said 50 delegates will represent this area at sessions set for the Woodbine Race Track in Toronto.

Discussing the convention program, Allison said it will explore all the problems confronting mankind today and systematically review the ultimate solution.

Allison said sessions are scheduled daily from 10 a.m. to 1:30 p.m. and 3 to 5:30 p.m. The program will feature four Bible dramas, lectures and general discussion periods.
