# Tykes defeat Thornhill 12-10

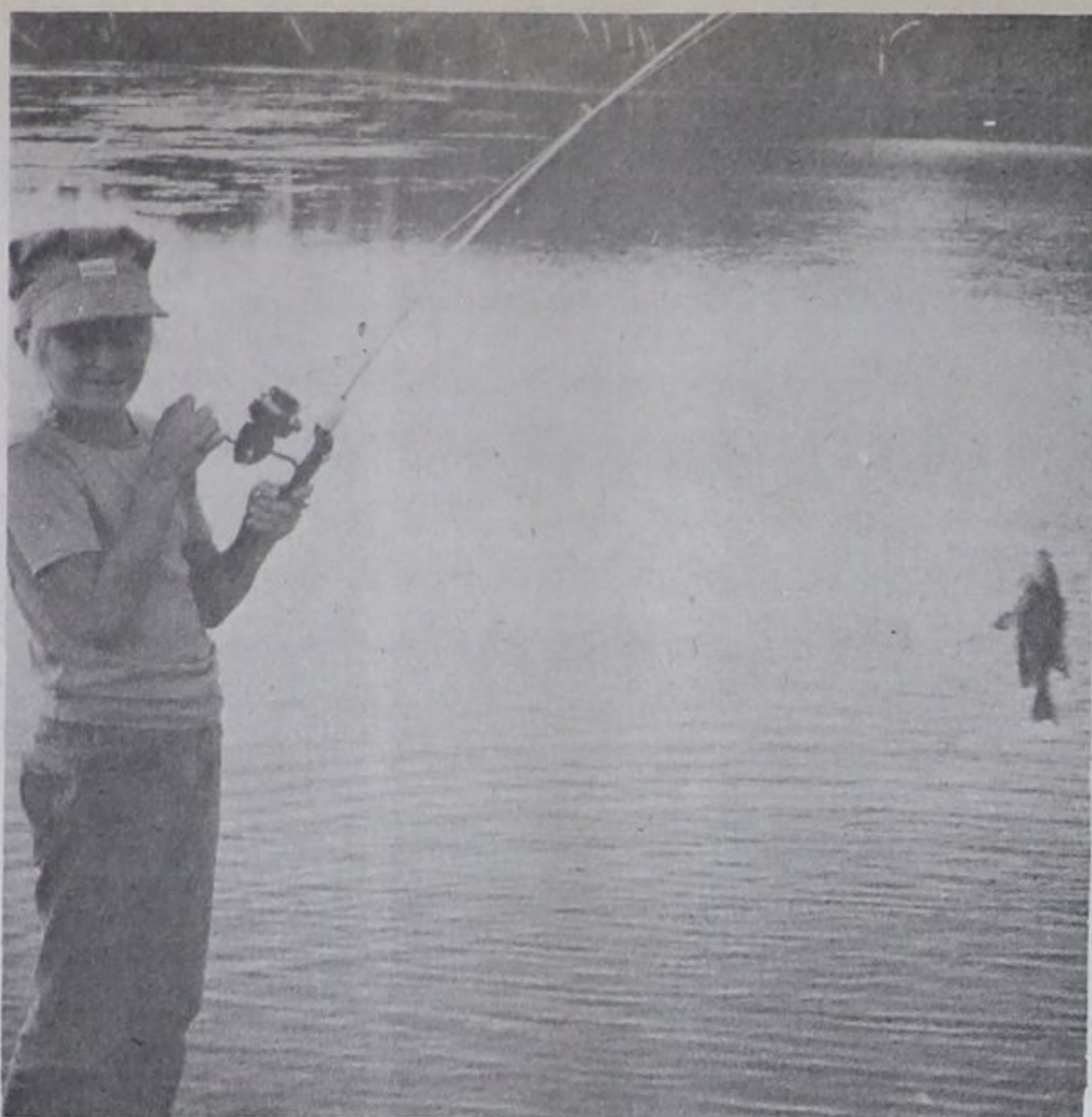

# Holstein Club to meet July 24

The Simcoe County Holstein Club will be cooperating with the Simcoe County Milk Committee on the annual Twilight meeting. This year's event is scheduled for Thursday, July 24 at Glenafon Farms at R.R. 2 Alliston.

The program will start at 7:15 p.m. Bert Stewart a well-known showman, judge and cattle fitter will give official placings on a class of eight heifer calves. He will then discuss the strong and weak points of each animal, and also describe how to help each calf achieve a higher placing on show day. A class of milking females will be discussed in the same manner. The programme will conclude with some lively entertainment and lunch.

Sheep information day and sale

This event is scheduled for the fairgrounds in Erin on Saturday, July 26. The starting time is 10 a.m.

There will be a weight guessing competition, exhibits and demonstrations, and an inspection of sale animals. The sale features 38 ram lambs and 25 ewe lambs which have been selected from 108 rams and 48 ewes on the basis of performance and physical soundness.

The Ontario Beef Calf Income Stabilization Program We have recently received details on the Beef Calf Income Stabilization Program of the Ontario Ministry of Agriculture and Food.

Participating producers will pay an annual fee per beef cow. For 1975 the fee is \$5 per cow. This fee does not have to be paid until January 31, 1976.

The cow count is based on cows which have produced a calf as of July 1. Cows producing fluid or industrial milk are ineligible.

In return for the \$5 per cow fee the beef calf producer gets a price guarantee per pound for his stocker calves. The guarantee is designed to cover operating cost plus a percentage of fixed cost on an efficient operation. This fall an actual price will be established by taking the weighted market price of Ontario produced stock calves. This price will be based on sales at major Ontario selling points. A payment will be made if the actual price is lower than the 50 cent guarantee on a 450-lb calf, assuming an 85 per

cent calf crop. A payment is best explained by an example. In a year of a 50 cent guarantee, and a 40 cent actual price, the payment would amount to 87 per cent of 450-lbs. times the 10 cent difference. The payout per cow, in this example, would be \$38.25.

Application forms are available from county offices of the Ontario Ministry of Agriculture and Food.

Current market information on feed grains, fruit and vegetables, hogs and sheep and farm weather is available by dialing a Toronto telephone number. The markets available, the daily updating times, and the respective telephone numbers are available on wallet sized cards which are available at county offices of the Ontario Ministry of Agriculture and Food.
