## Summer Jam '75 draws 200

The first of the Summer Jam '75 concerts was held Sunday night at the Midland Civic Centre. According to organizers, the concert was a success, drawing more than 200 people.

Sunday's concert featured such local talent as Paul Brown, Jim MacMillan, Lorne Pinkney, Don Rayment, Anne Brownell, John Brownell and Doug Cameron.

Judging from audience response, the remaining

concerts scheduled for this summer should enjoy success similar to Sunday night's.

Summer Jam '75 is modelled after a coffee house concept. Stressing informality, the audience sits at tables and listens to the performers at the front of the hall. Light refreshments are available for the hungry or thirsty, and the lights are kept low to stimulate an intimate atmosphere between performer and audience.

Proceeds from the door

cover the cost of equipment rental and hall charges, and the remainder is divided on an equal basis among the performers.

Summer Jam '75 seeks to provide a platform for

local talent. Also, it gives Midland residents a place to spend three or four rewarding hours on otherwise dull Sunday evenings.

The next coffee house is scheduled for August 3.

## Town Crier 'another service'

A new type of advertising has sprung up in the Midland area known as the Town Crier. Operated by Charles Hounsome of Wyebridge, it is a mobile unit using prerecorded messages. Hounsome started the service when he was laid off from his job at a local factory.
