To discuss future university courses

Glendon rep visits town

Mlle Thérèse Boutin, préposée à la liaison scolaire du Collège Glendon, est venue organiser le programme de cours qui seront offerts dès septembre. Elle vous deviendra familière puisque son travail consiste de faire le lien entre l'université et les gens de la place qui veulent s'enrolier dans ces cours.

En 1971-72, le gouvernement décida de poursuivre une étude de la situation des écoles françaises en Ontario. Comme résultat, une commission formée par l'A.C.F.O. présenta un rapport des recommandations au gouvernement. Par des octrois reçus, Glendon peut se permettre d'offrir des cours à Penetanguishene ou une population bilingue peut être mieux desservie.

Les cours d'immersion et de littératures offerts l'an dernier ont été fort appréciés. Pour cette année, d'autres cours ont été choisis au hasard avec espoir d'éveiller autant d'intérêt. Mais afin d'assurer la réalisation de ces cours, un minimum de 10 personnes

est requis. La gamme des cours est très variée pour plaire à tous ceux qui reconnaissent le besoin de se remettre aux études.

Mlle Boutin nous explique que si Glendon veut réaliser son but de bilinguisme, c'est bien ici à Penetanguishene où il y a du potentiel et des moyens d'y établir des cours d'extension. Ça prendra du temps, mais ça ouvre toute une nouvelle avenue pour les étudiants ainsi que pour l'université. 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UNIVERSITY AT L'UNIVERSITÉ À PENETANGUISHENE

Do you need a university credit to improve your qualifications or to upgrade your professional status? Or would you simply like to study for your own pleasure and self-improvement?

As in the autumn/winter session of 1974-75 and the summer session of 1975, Glendon College of York University (Toronto) will be sending professors to Penetanguishene to teach a number of courses. Each one will carry a full academic credit toward a Bachelor of Arts degree but, if you prefer to study for pure interest and pleasure without the obligation of writing examinations, you may enrol as an auditor.

Each course will consist of three hours of instruction one night a week, starting at 7:00 p.m., from September to April. Classes will be held in Ecole St-Joseph in Penetanguishene.

How many courses will be offered? Courses GL/FR335.3 and GL/FR336.3 are already a certainty. Whether the other courses will also be offered depends on how many persons indicate their serious interest in taking them.

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Glendon's Fall courses

Glendon College plans to continue offering university courses in Penetanguishene during the winter of 1975/76. The proposed courses which will be taught at Ecole de St. Joseph include:

Glendon College at Penetanguishene,
Winter 1975/76

GL PH252E History of Modern Philosophy. Western philosophy of the seventeenth and eighteenth centuries. Emphasis will be upon a close textual examination of certain central problems in philosophy as discussed by Descartes, Leibniz, Spinoza, Locke, Berkeley, Hume and Kant. No previous knowledge of philosophy will be presupposed.

GL PH252F Histoire de la Philosophie moderne. Ce cours étudie la philosophie de Descartes à Kant; on examinera les problèmes traditionnels de cette période, c'est-à-dire les problèmes épistémologiques et métaphysiques. GL HST253 The History of Medieval Europe. A general analysis of the major developments in the evolution of Latin Christendom from the Merovingian period to the end of the High Middle Ages. The course will emphasize cultural, ecclesiastical, intellectual, and institutional history. (Bruckmann — could also be offered in French)

GL FR150 or 151 Introductory French Language.

GL FR335.3 De l'Exil à la Résistance: Poésie et Chanson québécoises. Etude de quelques poètes et chansonniers qui ont le plus contribué à l'expression de la collectivité québécoise depuis 1950. Mise en parallèle de ces deux formes d'expression tant au niveau formel que thématique. (Fortier - demi-cours, evant - Noël, le mardi)

FL FR336.3 Théâtre québécois. Etude structurale et thématique de certaines oeuvres des auteurs les plus marquants du théâtre québécois contemporain: M. Dubé, R. Gurik, J. Languiand, M. Tremblay. (Fortier - demi-cours, après Noël, le mardi)

GL HU373 Panorama historique du Cinéma mondial. La naissance et l'évolution du cinéma abordées d'un point de vue esthétique et idéologique. L'assistance à la projection des films étudiés fait partie de l'horaire régulier de ce cours.

GL HU377 Woman's History. This course examines the historical development of woman's role, from 'primitive society' and ancient Greece to twentieth-century North America. In each case the focus will be on the position and potential of women. Finally, this course will explore the alternatives presented by the Women's Liberation Movement. (Humphrey; course may well be brought down to 200 level)

GL EN253 Contemporary Drama. A study of post-war plays with attention given to the practical aspects of contemporary theatre as well as its literary features.

GL EN432 Modern English Literature. A study of the literature of the twentieth century. Students have the opportunity to select authors for study in depth.

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The abandoned car is on the road to recovery.

There they sit. Ugly, rusting eyesores. Cars, abandoned in the night because they don't run anymore, they don't shine anymore. They don't do anything anymore but blotch fields and ruin landscapes.

What can we do?

We can put them on the road to recovery. Which is exactly what the Ontario Ministry of the Environment is doing.

The Ministry has initiated a program to get abandoned cars out of the fields and into recycling plants where valuable materials will be recovered and used.

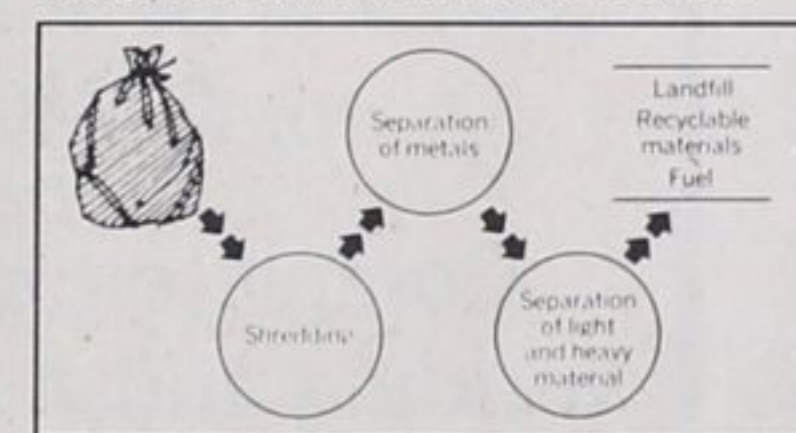
Three test programs have been completed, and a pilot project is under way in Temiskaming. The Ministry is now negotiating with 16 other municipalities in Ontario to start local programs as soon as possible.

Is it worth the trouble?

Five hundred thousand abandoned cars—that's how many are dotted across our beautiful province—say yes. It would be worth it just to get them out of sight.

But recycling abandoned cars will do a lot more than that.

Each heap will yield a ton of metal, metal we won't have to mine.



The system: step by step.

Metal we shouldn't mine, because our supply of natural resources won't last forever.

The road to recovery.

One of the main drains on our natural resources is the ever-increasing amount of garbage we all produce.

The Ministry is looking for ways to cut down on that amount. And it's starting to re-use our garbage. Recycling abandoned

cars is just one example.


Practically all of our garbage will be processed in recycling centres to be built right across the province. They'll turn garbage into valuable resources like fuel, landfill, paper, cardboard, metals.

The first of these centres is underway in North York. The rest will be strategically placed through Ontario in the next 15 years, with a transportation system and transfer stations to keep the whole network flowing.

When the system is fully operational, 90 per cent of Ontario's garbage will be recycled for re-use. The need for dumping grounds and landfill will be virtually eliminated.

It's a long and complicated road ahead.

But the route is clearly marked. And it leads to recovery.
